Mrs. Lohr Will Speak Here On German Tour

Mrs. Mary Lohr, of New York City, Honorary President of the National Catholic Women's Union, will speak in Rochester on Thursday evening, June 15 at 8:00 p.m. in St. Joseph's Basement Hall, Franklin St.

Mrs. Lohr will tell of her experiences while visiting in Germany and Rome last Fall, offices of the Rochester Branch announced.

At the invitation of Bishop Aloysius J. March, Apostolic Visitor in Germany Mrs. Lohr attended the "Katholischen Tag" in Germany last September.

While there she addressed 42 Women's Groups, and lived and worked with the Catholic Lay leaders in order to experience the difficulties under which these groups labor. Mrs. Lohr also visited with Theresa Neumann, the stigmatic of Konnersreuth.

One of the highlights of her trip was a private audience with the Pope. While in Rome she was commissioned, for the National Catholic Women's Union, to furnish the challenges, monstrances, and vestments for three hundred chapels which our Holy Father is erecting in Germany.

This project is well on the road to success, she reports. To date through her talks in various localities, half of the sum necessary to pay for these articles has been raised. Anyone interested in this work is invited to hear Mrs. Lohr speak.

A year ago, under Mrs. Lohr's direction, the National Catholic Women's Union successfully completed its one-million-articles Infants Clothing Drive for the needy infants in Germany.

The Rochester Branch of the National Catholic Women's Union is sponsoring the talk.
