mon challenge faces peoples and governments in the widespread unemployment which is "feeding the cold war and threatening to make the situation explode into a hot war," Pope Pius XII warned in an address stressing the need for Christian programs of social justice.

The Pope spoke to a group of Catholic labor leaders and teachers from -16 nations, including the United States, gathered here for the International Congress of Social Studies.

UNLESS A universal program aimed at attaining a normal productivity capable of securing steady employment is put into force, the Pope asserted there is a possibility that countless millions of people, lured by dernagogues and false promises, will revoit against the existing social

Obviously referring to Communism, Pope Pius declared that the lack of social justice had made discontented and impoverished people a fertile breeding ground for "the spirit of evil." For that reson, he said, unemployment is "the most urgent problem which weighs like a nightmare" upon all old industrial countries.
