Alfred University Gives Degree To Noted Jesuit

Hornell — The Very Rev. Robert I. Gannon, S.J., former Fordham University president, took 235 graduates of Alfred University Monday that an rational optimism is within the grasp of anyone not spiritually handicapped.

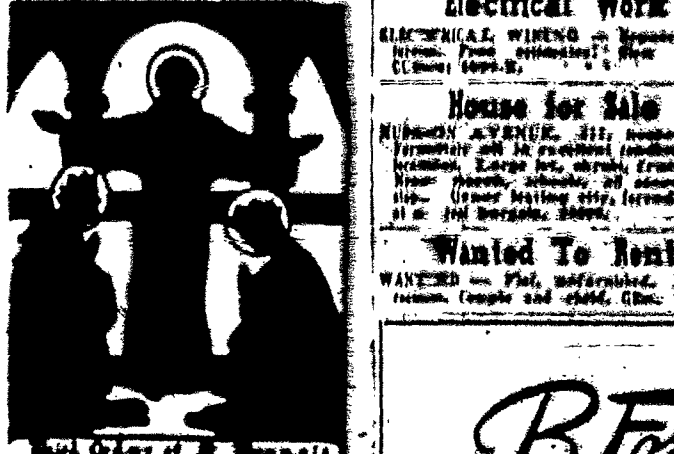

Attention of members is directed to the following editorial from the Franciscan Forum:

"Among the intentions the Holy Father has for the present Jubilee year is this: That all outside the Catholic Church, those who are astray from the right path, even those who deny of hate God, may under the light and grace of God be brought to obey the precepts of the Gospel."
