CVW Post Seeks New Members

Plans have been made by the Sacred Heart Post No. 1127, Catholic War Veterans to launch a membership drive marking the fifteenth anniversary of the incorporation of the CVW in New York State.

The proposed building, which is now underway, is being constructed of tapestry brick, adorned with permanent terra cotta. The construction will also include a masonry block, the interior of the auditorium will be decorated with a masonry block, new in design and construction.

The building will be so constructed that the entire basement can be used, having a ceiling of 12 feet. The room in the basement will be adequate to accommodate bowling alleys, meeting rooms, shower and locker rooms, boiler room, etc.

Also at the speakers' table were the club moderators, the Rev. Oscar W. Regan, C.S.B. and the Rev. Vincent A. Fullerton.

Outgoing officers who served as a committee for the banquet and were commended on their administrations were Mrs. Carl Samuelson, Mrs. Stanley Fowal, Mrs. Paul Moonan and Mrs. John T. O'Hara.

The new community room is said to be remarkable for its beauty and size. It is 24 by 48 feet, completely carpeted; the walls are a light rose, the ceiling, var-colored. New community tables have been ordered.

Also under construction at the present time is an extension of the present kitchen, enlargement of the dining room. The work room of the new addition has built in ironing boards, space for sewing, storage cabinets, etc.

A deep basement is provided under the addition making room for recreation for the Nuns. The new addition at least doubles the capacity of the old convent. The addition will cost less than \$50,000, completely furnished.

The stage will be fitted with the newest equipment in lighting. The building, when completed, will accommodate an auditorium at least 1,500 to 2,000 people, and as a gymnasium, it will provide ample room for a regulation high school basketball court, with plenty of space for spectators.
