The young priest received his elementary education at the Elmira Heights school and was graduated from St. Basil's in 1943.

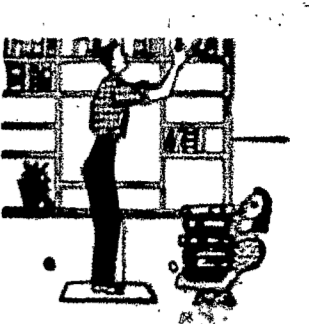
