

Continent Union Urged by Prelate

Tampa, Fla. — (RNS) — Union of the Americas is a step toward the American nations which distinguish the American nations from each other, the American world was advocated by His Eminence Manuel Cardinal Arceaga y Betancourt, Archbishop of Havana, in an address to the University of Tampa graduating class here.

Stressing "the urgent necessity for the union and mutual defense" of the Americas "if our civilization is to be saved," Cardinal Arceaga y Betancourt declared in Spanish:

"Without affecting the individual characteristics which distinguish the American nations from each other, the American world should increasingly organize their forces in order to bring prosperity to our cultural heritage and to combat the atheist revolution which seeks to undermine the religious and democratic foundations of our countries, for on these democratic foundations rests the guarantee of our liberty and respect for the full dignity of man."

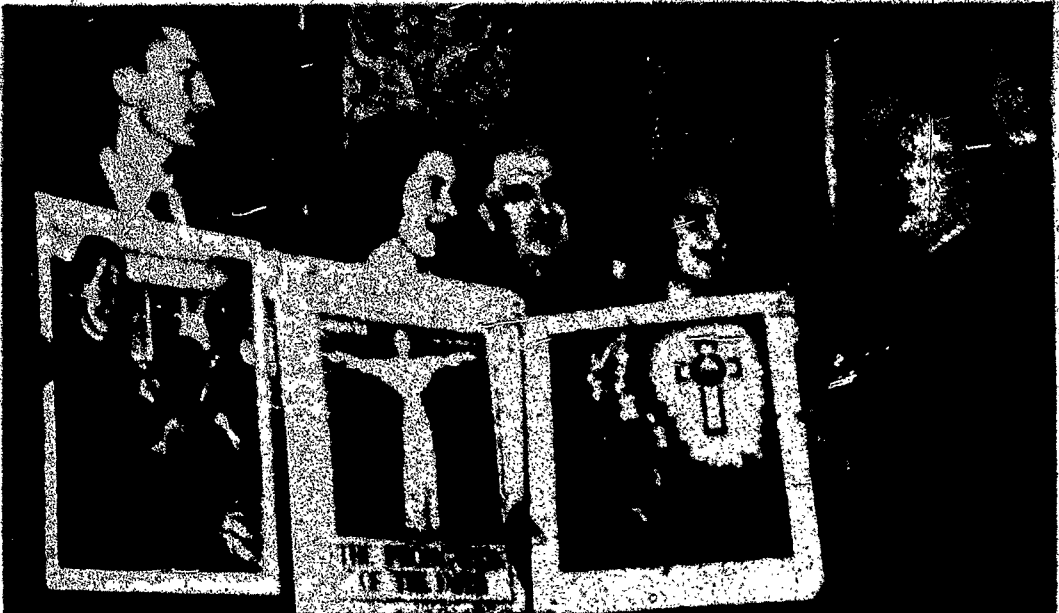

Balancing The Books

Two Sad Problems — Drink And Race

It has been estimated that there are some three million alcoholics in the United States, practically one to every family. The problem they present is a sizeable and serious one. Scientific study has thrown much light upon its causes, its elements, and its solution. Techniques for coping with it (notably that of Alcoholics Anonymous) have been devised and proved effective in action.

But not nearly enough people are familiar with the true nature of alcoholism and how it can be successfully overcome. Hence one hopes that *Easy Does It: The Story of Mac* by Hugh Reilly will be widely read.

THIS BOOK harrowingly spells out the history of an alcoholic. The author has put a representative case history in fictional form. This he has done cummily indeed. There is no need to detail the work's shortcomings as fiction, but by every test, from character-sounding to dialogue, this effort is decidedly amateurish.

And yet it is engrossing and memorable, because, however maladroitly, it is telling the stark truth.

known as the Padre there comes an inveterate alcoholic named John McDermitt, out of a job, desperate, and looking for help. He gives the Padre a manuscript to read, the unsparingly frank account of what he calls his descent into hell. In it the successive stages of the alcoholic's enslavement are graphically described.

Then McDermitt is taken in hand by two members of Alcoholics Anonymous, and the successive stages of his rehabilitation are presented. All this is as new to the Padre as it is to Mac, hence lengthy explanations are made. In the end, McDermitt is free of his demon and has helped save the woman who, separated from him years before, went his way in misery. The Padre is about to marry them as the story comes to a close.

The tendency is to consider the racial problem as soluble either by stark "social engineering" or by an appeal to idealism. Father La Farge maintains that neither "man-centered humanism" nor "an exclusively transcendental religious attitude" will, by itself, do the job. Rather, success will come "if we have the faith and courage to state and practice all that religion and practical wisdom have to say about the human relations problem."

Parish School Control Issue In Great Britain

London — (RNS) — His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop of Westminster, described the campaign of British Catholics to get a better break for their schools as a fight "against possible usurpation of the rights of the Church and the parents by the state."

"We know how in totalitarian states the first thing that is latched is usually the education of the children," the Cardinal declared. "Their leaders wish to ingenerate into the minds and souls of the children their false doctrines."

The ranking British prelate also criticized proposals for universal religious teaching in all schools. "I feel myself," he said, "that the agreed syllabus type of religion, drawn up as it is by people sometimes entirely devoid of religion will lead to the secularization of the schools."

Released-Time Legal Here, N. Y. Supreme Court Rules

New York — (RNS) — Legality of the New York plan for "released-time" religious instruction was upheld in the state Supreme Court here by Justice Anthony J. DeGiovanna.

The decision, which the New York City Board of Education had asked to be set aside, was handed down by Justice DeGiovanna in a unanimous opinion.
