Owego Graduates Hear Advice Of Father Murphy

Owego — "You have been taught to live your Catholic faith in your everyday life and this teaching you should follow" was the advice given by the Rev. John Murphy, assistant pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Elmira, to 15 members of the 1950 graduating class of St. Patrick's Parochial School, Friday evening.

Father Murphy told the class that by putting into practice the training they had received in the parochial school, where God had been the center of their education, they would always be good Christians and good Americans.

He stated that if men were straightened out the world would soon straighten itself out. He called to their attention that they had been taught to be governed by the teachings of the Apostolic Creed and the Commandments. These truths should govern their lives in the years ahead.

Miss Barbara Burke, who attended the class average of 97.5, received the scholarship, while John Miller was given the citizenship prize. This latter prize was donated by Toga Ival, American Legion, to the student who throughout the school years had given himself an ideal citizen.

The social studies prize, given by the Auxiliary of Toga Post, American Legion, was won by Mary Marie Hager, who received the reports average of 100. The Christian Doctrine prize, given by Court St. Rose of Lima, Catholic Daughters of America, were given to Miss Barbara Burke, of the eighth grade, Miss Rose Marie Raitt, of the seventh grade, Miss Mary Hawn, of the sixth grade.

The prizes and diplomas were given to the graduates by the Rev. Michael L. Ryan, pastor. The convocation closed with the benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.
