

### St. Joseph Sisters Plan Flight To French Meeting

Reverend Mother Rose Miriam, S.S.J., and Sister Marie, S.S.J., principal of St. Anne's School, will fly to Europe next Wednesday to represent the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Rochester Diocese at the celebration of the 75th anniversary of the founding of their community in Le Puy, France, July 17-20.

At Le Puy, near Lyons, the Rochester Sisters will join representatives of the 30,000 Sisters of St. Joseph in every part of the world in a series of religious ceremonies and conferences called "A Tridium of Thanks giving."

SOME 30 MOTHERHOUSES of their communities in the United States will send delegates included in the tercentenary program. All the pontifical Masses, sessions on the origin development and future of the world-wide community and a pageant depicting the 17th century martyrdom of Sister Marie Garnier, one of the party members.
