### Judge McGarey Of Brooklyn, Dies

Surrogate Francis D. McGarey of Brooklyn, who was the Column Day lay speaker for Rochester Council Knights of Columbus in 1948, died June 23, 1950 in his home city.

A Papal Knight, widely known in charitable and civic enterprises and high in the state council activities of the Knights of Columbus, Judge McGarey, 56 was honored by a eulogical dignitary, state and city officials and religious and fraternal groups at funeral services held June 27 in St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York.

Three brothers, the Most Rev. Thomas E. Molloy of Brooklyn, the Most Rev. Raymond A. Kearney Auxiliary Bishop of Brooklyn and the Most Rev. James J. Griffiths Auxiliary Bishop of the Military Ordinariate were in the sanctuary.

Judge McGarey was a member of the laymen's retreat group held in the State Knights of Columbus for many years. He had an extensive record of parish, diocesan, fraternal and community projects as a leader and contributor.
