### Nazareth Features Music In Summer-Time Courses

Registration for all courses at the Nazareth College Summer Session reached a record high this week as classes began on July 5, college officials announced.

Sessions will be held Monday through Friday every week until August 11 with special Saturday sessions on July 8 and 29. Besides undergraduate courses of instruction in academic subjects, music and secretarial methods, the college offers library courses arranged in a three summer sequence and a department of teacher education for future teachers of elementary, parochial schools.

### Liturgical Music Set In Nazareth Summer Classes

A special summer session in Church Music will be held at Nazareth College, Rochester, on July 11 and 12.

Although given for the Sisters of St. Joseph, the course is open to priests, chorists and organists as well. Starting at 8:30 a. m. five hours each day will be devoted to the study of Gregorian Chant, Polyphony and Chant Accompaniment.

Gregorian Chant professor will be the Rev. Ethelbert Thibault, Ph.D., who has made an exhaustive study of the Chant in Rome and Paris besides having 23 years practical experience as choirmaster of the Sulphur Seminary in Montreal.

The polyphony teacher, Rev. Alfred Bernier, S.F., holds a doctorate from the Pontifical Institute of Sacred Music in Rome and is Rector of St. Ignace College.

Both priests are from the Faculty of the Gregorian Institute of America, which has a church music students and graduates in 61 cities and 11 states in the United States, and 26 cities in 17 foreign countries and Canada.

SEVERAL DIOCESES, under the patronage of their Bishops and Archbishops have already adopted the Gregorian Institute courses in Auburn in the Holy Father's encyclicals, and curricula regarding the importance of sacred music.

Featured at the Nazareth College session will be an exhibit of church music for various purposes for choir work, for the organist and for offering excellent liturgical suggestions for report books.

### Hungarian Bishops Defend Religious

Budapest — RNS — Hungarian Roman Catholic bishops issued a pastoral letter here repudiating recent charges made against monks and nuns belonging to religious orders in the Communist-dominated country.

The pastoral letter, read in all Budapest churches, was an obvious reply to Education Minister Joseph Reval who had branded the nation's 12,000 monks and nuns as agents of imperialism and spreaders of war hysteria.

Defending members of the religious orders against the accusation, the Bishops asserted that recent measures taken against some convents and monasteries were frequently arranged by a responsible non official elements.
