

Diocesan High School Sodalists Voice Plans As They Sail On Holy Year Tour

Excited Sodalists from Rochester diocesan high schools waved good-byes from the deck of the SS Roma Wednesday as the luxury liner carrying 400 members of the nation's Sodality of Our Lady, their parents and teachers sailed from New York harbor for Lisbon on the first leg of a Holy Year pilgrimage.

Fifty priests, Sisters and students from the Diocese of Rochester will visit shrines, have an audience with Pope Pius XII and enjoy four days of elaborate sight-seeing tours in four nations before returning to New York August 21.

JUST BEFORE sailing, Marie Brown and Marjanne Crino of Mercy High were trying to solve the problem of how to get a change of wardrobe for a Rome pilgrimage into two suit cases. Marjanne's brother Michael was looking forward to the chance to ride up into the Eiffel Tower and Frank Pilecki was completing arrangements to visit the Salesian Monastery in France, the center of Gregorian music.

But packing for the forty-day trip wasn't the only problem to be solved in the preparation. The question of "how much film will record all the things I'll want to remember in sea's to come" also presented itself.

Film is not easily available in Europe, the Sodalists have heard and must be packed along with ample supplies of soap which is rationed in European countries.

The photograph Marjanne hopes to have snapped is a picture of herself at the Colosseum where her mother had her own picture taken some twenty years ago.

IN A WAVE of breathless chatter Marie said "Of course I'm looking forward to the visits to the shrines and the home of the Little Flower and the audience with the Pope but I've always wanted to have dinner in a sidewalk cafe in Paris after a tour of the fashion salons."

But Aquinas students Mike Crino and Frank Pilecki make other plans. If we have time I'd like to see a bullfight in Madrid," Michael put in.

INCLUDED IN THE pilgrimage from the Rochester diocese are seven priests, two Sisters of St. Joseph and fourteen Sisters of Mercy. Priests from the Rochester Diocese include the Reverend Fathers, Vincent J. Sullivan, Edward A. Gorman, Joseph J. Gorman, Joseph P. Norton, Edward J. Tolster, William J. Shannon and Charles R. Naville.

Special sightings 2 days have been arranged for the pilgrims. A pilgrimage to the shrine of Our Lady of the Rosary in Fatima is listed as the first high light after landing in Lisbon, July 22. After stopping in Madrid and sightseeing in Barcelona, the Sodalists will take a pilgrimage to Our Lady of the Most Holy of the Most Holy of the Most Holy, the place where St. Ignace dedicated himself to the Blessed Mother.

The shrine of Our Lady of the Most Holy of the Most Holy of the Most Holy will be the next stopping place on July 29-30. From there on, six and a day of leisure on

the French Riviera and then the pilgrims will travel to Rome.

AN AUDIENCE with the Pope has been scheduled in the week of August 18 while the Sodalists visit Rome. Having gained the indulgences of the Holy Year and sampled the extensive sightseeing tours of the Eternal City and the Vatican, the Sodalists will leave Rome for Paris traveling through Italy and the Italian Alps.

In Paris Aug. 9 another pilgrimage will be formed to the shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal and from there they will go to Lourdes, the home of the Little Flower. St. Therese. They will sail from Le Havre on Aug. 12 and reach New York at 10 a. m. August 21.

The Sodality Pilgrimage to Rome is being sponsored by the Queen's Work, a sodality month's publication.
