CDA Courts Urged To Kill Poison Of Secularism

The 200,000 Catholic Daughters of America "can become the most powerful influence of our day by providing the antiseptic for the deadly poison of secularism traveling through veins and arteries to our nation's heart."

This plea to members of the organization which has 14 units in Rochester diocese was made by Bishop William F. Hatley of Asheville speaking at Asheville, N.C.

The Bishop delivered the sermon at a Solemn Votive Mass for peace in St. Lawrence's Church, Asheville, at which His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, presided. The Mass was a highlight of the 23rd biennial convention of the Catholic Daughters of America.

The occasion marked the first time that a Cardinal attended a convention of the 47-year-old organization and Cardinal Spellman was given a civic welcome by Mayor Clarence E. Morgan of Asheville.

The convention also brought together the three Bishops who have administered the Diocese of Raleigh since its establishment 25 years ago—Bishop Hatley, who served from 1925-37; Bishop Eugene J. McGuinness of Oklahoma City and Tulsa, from 1937-45; and Bishop Vincent S. Waters of Raleigh, who has served since 1945 and who is national chaplain of the CDA.

OTHER PRELATES attending included Bishops John Mark Gannon of Erie; Francis J. Hickey of Grand Rapids; John J. Russell of Charleston; John M. McNamara, Auxiliary of Washington; John F. Cody, Auxiliary of St. Louis; and Francis E. Hyland, Auxiliary of Savannah-Atlanta.

Theme of the convention is "You Can Change the World," borrowed from the title of the book by the Rev. James M. Keller, M.M., founder and director of The Christophers. Father Keller delivered the convention keynote address.

Bishop Hatley exhorted Catholic women to "reconsecrate themselves to the 'Share the Faith' movement and to live exemplary Christian lives 'in homes, in social gatherings, in the markets of trade or business, in recreation resorts, on all the highways and byways of life.'"

Recalling a quotation from the "Catechism of Catechists," "Catch us the little foxes that destroy the vines," Bishop Hatley declared that a menace more terrible than the "big black bear of atheistic communism" is the nation's No. 1 enemy, "the little fox of secularism."

He counseled the Catholic women that by living exemplary lives they can have an "immediate effect on the tens of thousands of Catholics in whose spiritual lives the poison of secularism is already manifest."

Mooney, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Rochester as deacon and the Rev. Richard Torrey, associate editor, Catholic Courier Journal, subdeacon.

Benediction will be at 4:30 p.m.

London - (NC) — "For the next 30 years we in Leicester have got to find five pence (10 cents) a minute, 24 hours a day, 60 minutes an hour to give our children Catholic education," the Rev. Michael Gilleran told a local meeting of the Knights of St. Columban at Long Eaton, Derbyshire.

After a four-year struggle to collect funds builders have started work on the first of the new Catholic schools in Leicester. It will cost the Catholics 73,000 pounds (\$204,400).
