Fr. Crowley, 25 Years Pastor, Honored

Auburn — The Rev. John B. Crowley, pastor of St. Aloysius Church, Auburn, and St. Joseph's Church, Cayuga, was honored at a reception and dinner in Osborne Hotel Tuesday, July 11 on his 25th anniversary as pastor of the two churches.

A check for \$1,000, contributed by the St. Aloysius parish, was presented Father Crowley by City Clerk George B. Shannon. A \$100 check was presented by Richard Perkins on behalf of the Cayuga parish.

Father Crowley thanked everyone who contributed and told of his happiness at completing a quarter of a century of work in one parish.

In attendance besides the parishioners was the Rev. Joseph O'Connor of Trenton, N. J. Father Crowley's relatives from Ithaca also attended.

The reception was a surprise for Father Crowley. Called to the palm room of the hotel on a pretext, the popular pastor was greeted by the parishioners and the all male choir of St. Aloysius with a special anniversary song.

The Rev. Joseph P. Hanley, assistant pastor of St. Aloysius, led Father Crowley to the head table.

Father Hanley thanked all the members of the committee in charge for their work in carrying out this reception. He said that without the cooperation of all the members of the church, the party could have not been kept a secret. After the presentation of the purse, coffee, cake and ice cream were served.

The choir was under the direction of Clarence Hayden.

Father Crowley was appointed pastor of St. Aloysius Church 25 years ago by the late Bishop Thomas F. Healy, to replace the
