**'Father Baker's
Anniversary To
Be Noted July 29**

A number of friends of the Rt. Rev. Nelson H. Baker, known throughout the world simply as "Father" Baker, will journey to Lackawanna, Saturday July 29, to participate in services marking the 14th anniversary of the death of this great priest and citizen.

Services will consist of Solemn Requiem Mass at 10 o'clock in the National Shrine and Basilica of Our Lady of Victory followed by the customary procession to the grave of "The Padre of the Poor" in nearby Holy Cross cemetery. Father Baker died July 29, 1936 and at his own request was buried alongside his father and mother. His grave is visited by increasing thousands each year.

FOR THE SECOND consecutive year, Mayor John J. Janiga of Lackawanna has declared "Father Baker Day" a civic holiday. City streets will be decorated for the occasion. An hour-long sacred concert in the Basilica will precede the Requiem Mass.

Father Baker's Boy's Band will lead the procession to the grave where a short service will be held. Both Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, CSC, Bishop of Buffalo, and Most Rev. Joseph A. Burke, D.D. Auxiliary Bishop are expected to attend. Last year more than 3,000 persons of all walks in life of every creed participated in these annual rites.

A large number of Buffalo and Lackawanna policemen and firemen will act as honor guard to the religious civic and social dignitaries in the procession.

Rt. Rev. Joseph E. Maguire, pastor of the Shrine and Basilica, and the Rev. Joseph M. McPherson, superintendent of Father Baker's Homes of Charity in Erie will be in Buffalo.

Those who cannot be present for the formal morning services, are told that the Shrine and Basilica, Father Baker's last great work and the grave will be readily available for visitations.
