Share the wealth plans frequently have been treated with amusement or contempt in this country. The very expression "share the wealth" usually is associated with crack pots, socialists and other partisans of the lunatic fringe.

Yet sharing wealth has its origins in the Christian tradition. The early Christians sometimes are called "communists" because of their fervent addiction for sharing their possessions with other in the light of this tradition, the Church always has spoken strongly on the obligations of those with superfluous incomes. I.e. incomes so great that, after an adequate standard of living is provided for the owners, a great deal remains.

Specifically, Pope Pius XI suggests the investment of superfluous income in searching for favorable opportunities for employment provided the labor employed produces results which are really useful to be considered an act of real liberality particularly appropriate for the needs of our time.

Will the same type of materialist propaganda again be launched on the world? Will we continue to beam the specious Hollywood version of "democracy" and "Americanism" so that "freedom" confused with the streamlined automobile and the luxurious shower bath?

FOR EXAMPLE, I do not think it would be amiss for General Motors, United States Steel, or the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company to use some of their superfluous income in the building of housing projects for their workers.

COMMUNISM is an evil thing. Yes, and Washington can do the world an immense service by pointing out its evil, certainly. But it cannot do this job unless the men charged with the program have themselves a clear idea of what is evil and what is good. That lack in their viewpoint is the danger of the hour.
