Girls' Survey Shows Broken Home Cause of Delinquency

Paris — (NC) — Family failures, particularly divorce, are named as the main cause of juvenile delinquency in a book, "Guilty Youth Accuses You," written by Odette Philippon, a member of the Women's League of French Catholic Action.

A statistical study of the causes of delinquency the book has received the commendation of His Holiness Pope Pius XII. MISS PHILIPPON cites figures in her book showing that one of the major factors in delinquency cases is divorce. Other major causes of delinquency, she states, are poverty and alcoholism. To these causes she adds social evils such as slums, prostitution and disease especially venereal diseases and tuberculosis.

What is needed to remedy this situation, Miss Philippon declares, is the "transformation of the economic structure of the world to eliminate pauperism and to provide each family with means to live a healthy, prosperous, independent life."

Fiction Featured In New Magazine

New York — (NC) — Inauguration of a new magazine which its sponsors hope will become the center of a Catholic literary movement in the United States has been announced here.

Called A.D. — for Anno Domini — the first edition of the new publication will go to press in September. It will specialize mainly in the contemporary short story. There will be columns on contemporary art, the theater, books and "a new kind of literary editorial," as well as occasional articles on music and the other arts.

The announcement said that although the magazine is in no way formally connected with the university, A.D. is to be edited and published by a group who came together at Fordham's Institute of Professional Writing. The editors are the Rev. Demetrius Manousis, O.F.M. Cap., contributor to America and other magazines, script writers for Catholic comic books; Anne Freemantle, assistant professor of journalism at Fordham and associate editor of The Commonwealth; and David Marshall, Professor of Journalism at Fordham.
