Irish-American Holy Year Tour To Rome Slated

Irish-Americans from every section of the United States are joining the Irish-American Holy Year Pilgrimage to Rome sponsored by the United Irish Societies of New Jersey. It was announced in Newark.

The members will sail from New York on Oct. 23 in the R.M.S. Queen Mary of the Cunard Line, under personal leadership of the Rev. Joseph C. Lenihan, chaplain of the Newark Police Department. A HIGHLIGHT of the pilgrimage will be a twelve-day visit to Ireland featuring devotions at beloved shrines, sightseeing in Dublin, the Kingdom of Kerry, Blarney Castle and other points dear to the heart of the Gael.

On the return trip, Father Lenihan will lead the pilgrims through the Holy Doors of the principal basilicas—St. Peter's, St. Paul's Outside-the-Walls, St. John Lateran and St. Mary Major—to pray for the Holy Year Intention.

Pope Pius X Cause Advanced A Step, Bishop Informed

Announcement that the Sacred Congregation of Rites has taken a new and important step towards the beatification of Pope Pius X was satisfactorily received this week by His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

Bishop Kearney is a member of the Episcopal Committee of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, a group of seven bishops which directs the work of the Confraternity in the United States.

THIS EPISCOPAL Committee organized American efforts on behalf of the Cause of Pope Pius X in 1945. A national Crusade of Prayer under Confraternity auspices that year resulted in a total of 157,759,175 prayers and good works which were presented in the form of a spiritual bouquet to Pope Pius XII during the first American postwar pilgrimage in 1948.

Two Holy Year pilgrimages sponsored by the Confraternity's National Center in Washington are featuring special devotions at the tomb of Pius X in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.
