## Clergy of Three Faiths Expose Stockholm Appeal

Washington (NC) — Prominent clergymen from each of America's three major faiths have warned their fellow Americans against the "spurious peace petition" of the communists, the so-called Stockholm Appeal, and have offered a five-point program for "genuine peace."

The Stockholm Appeal, which is circulated by communists and pro-communist organizations, "is a camouflage designed to confuse the free societies and to conceal the aggressive policies revealed in the invasion of Korea," the clergymen declared. "It is these aggressive policies and actual aggression which constitute the greatest menace to world peace," they added.

## New Anti-Catholic Paper In U. S. Mail

(When a violent anti-Catholic paper appeared last week in Cleveland and elsewhere, the alert CATHOLIC UNIVERSE-BULLETIN, official weekly of the Diocese of Cleveland, exposed the bigoted literature in the following story:)

Cleveland (Special) — Newest piece of anti-Catholic literature being mailed into this area is called the "Liberty Bell."

It arrives in your neighbor's mailbox accompanied by an introductory letter which says:

"This issue of LIBERTY BELL was paid for and expected to be mailed to you by a friend of yours who is aware of the Roman Catholic menace in the United States and wants to have a part in stopping its growth among the ignorant voters."

"Now is the time for action by all Protestants, if we are to prevent Roman Catholic control of the Government and all American institutions, private and public. These dangers can be averted only by the united efforts of all non-Catholics. That is why the Protestant Church is appealing for your support."

"If this Church had the money, it would gladly mail copies of this LIBERTY BELL to all Americans; it has free-will donations can LIBERTY BELL be kept ringing the alarm against the Roman Catholic foreign enemy? Be as generous as you can."

The letter is signed, "The Puritan Church — The Church of America," followed by a handwritten signature, "Its Chancellor." There is no name.

"Its Chancellor" turns out to be Harrison Parker, 72, who lives in the Claridge Hotel, Washington, D. C., and is under charges of mail fraud and tax evasion.

"The Puritan Church — The Church of America," it develops, has no formal membership, no church edifice, and holds no meetings.

It has a small office to handle mail at 1612 I St., N.W., in Washington, and owns a \$30,000 plot there at Tilden St. and Rock Creek Park, N.W., on which it proposes to erect a "Protestant Embassy," which, Parker points out, would be only "11 minutes by auto from the White House."

THE PURPOSE of the "Protestant Embassy," Parker says, is to "protect the Constitution."

## State Department Refusal To Negotiate Through Vatican Prolonged World War II

St. Paul, Minn. (Special) — Because the State Department refused to negotiate through the Pope, the U.S. in 1945 turned down a golden opportunity to end World War II six months sooner.

Save the lives of many soldiers. Avoid the atom-bombing of Japan. Prevent the post-war sweep of communism into China, Korea and other areas.

Authority for these statements was provided this week in an article by Rear Admiral Ellis M. Zacharias, reprinted by the Catholic Digest here from Look magazine.

ADMIRAL ZACHARIAS said that in 1944, while he was chief of the 11th Naval District in San Diego, he outlined for Secretary of the Navy James F. Forrestal (later secretary of defense) a campaign of psychological warfare designed to bring about a Japanese surrender.

At this time, Zacharias wrote, "the Emperor of Japan asked the Holy See to intervene on his behalf negotiations with us, with Pope Pius XII himself acting as intermediary." Zacharias said this move also involved members of the Office of Strategic Services, along with Pietro Cardinal Fumasoni Biondi, head of the Propagation for the Faith, and Archbishop Peter Doi of Tokyo.

ADMIRAL ZACHARIAS said that in 1944, while he was chief of the 11th Naval District in San Diego, he outlined for Secretary of the Navy James F. Forrestal (later secretary of defense) a campaign of psychological warfare designed to bring about a Japanese surrender.

He said that Forrestal accepted his judgement that the Yalta decision was a mistake, and that if the war were not ended before Russia attacked Japan, Stalin would have too much power in China. He and Forrestal, however, were overruled by Army leaders.

"While we were developing (this plan) more urgent messages reached us from the Holy See. They brought us a truly desperate plea the Emperor had just flashed to the Pope through Archbishop Doi."

"Shortly afterwards, Cardinal Fumasoni-Biondi was told that someone in Washington was not looking favorably at his efforts. So his plea, too, had to be abandoned, although it promised the greatest results."

Admiral Zacharias said the Potsdam Declaration finally wrecked all efforts to halt the bloodshed and give America a secure postwar strategic position, which would have made the containment of communism relatively easy.
