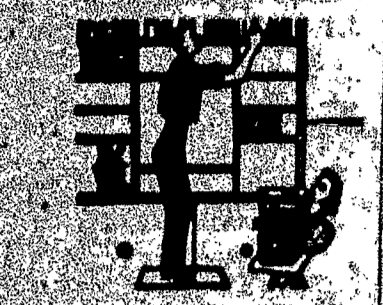


Two Nuns Mark Golden Jubilee

Military Parade Will Feature Memorial Mass

1100 Sponsors Reported For Radio-Rosary Program

Eleven hundred sponsors willing to back the continuance of the Family Rosary for Peace broadcasts aired nightly on WSAY, poured nearly \$4,400 into the program's treasury this week, the Family Rosary executive committee announced today.

The gifts were the first wave of returns from 20,000 direct-mail appeals sent July 30 to families in the Rochester area requesting financial assistance for the program. Sponsors were asked to give \$2.50 or \$10 to help defray the program expenses which total more than \$1,000 a month.

A SPECIAL appeal sent in the name of His Excellency Bishop Kearney has produced 14 other gifts of \$200 apiece, the committee said.

The following parishes and societies have contributed \$2,808 for continuation of the radio-Rosary: Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union, St. Joseph's, Immaculate Conception, Holy Redeemer, Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Corpus Christi, Sacred Heart Cathedral, St. Andrew's Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, St. Ambrose, St. John the Evangelist and St. Augustine, 1st District Commandery, Knights of St. John and Ladies' Auxiliary of Knights of St. John. Bishop Kearney inaugurated this parochial fund with his own check for \$200.

Noting that the individual and family gifts in the \$7,200 total have so far averaged nearly \$4, the program's executive committee hoped that 5,000 more "sponsors" would mail in "at least \$3 apiece this month to guarantee the continuation of the program for the next year."
