Father Monroe Named Head Of New Novitiate

Rev. John F. Monroe, O.P., son of Michael F. Monroe, 29 Fulton Ave., Rochester has been appointed Prior of the newly opened Novitiate, of the Dominican Fathers in Dover, Mass. His father, and sister Miss Mary Monroe, have been informed here.

The new foundation of the Dominican Fathers was established on August 4, the Feast of St. Dominic, at which time Father Monroe conferred the Religious Habit on 36 young men who had completed 4 years of high school and 2 years of college.

The new Prior's term is for three years. Previously he had served for three terms of 9 years as president of Aquinas College conducted by the Dominican Fathers in Columbus, Ohio.

A GRADUATE of St. Andrew's Seminary, Father Monroe studied at Province College and received his B.A. degree in 1927. He earned his Master's degree at the Catholic University of America and was sent to the Philippine Islands for further study at St. Thomas University in Manila. There he was awarded the degree of Doctor of Letters and Doctor of Philosophy.

In March of 1941 Father Monroe was named a member of the faculty of Providence College, Providence, R. I. where he served until appointed to Aquinas College.

When in the far East, Father Monroe served three years at Poo Chow, China as procurator of the Dominican Order's regional seminary. He spent three more years in Kienow, China, where he studied the language and customs of the people and worked as a missionary.
