Others appearing in this week's cast at the Hayloft are George LaBuda as Carlton Fitzgerald, the play's director; Sada Thompson as the producer's wife; Edward Ivory as Peter Sloan, the new play's idealistic author; and William Smithers as Owen Turner, a somewhat cynical playwright.

Next week the Hayloft group will present George Bernard Shaw's delightful romantic comedy, "Candida."
