Four young men from the Diocese of Rochester, two from Rochester and two from Elmira, were received into novitiate of the Franciscan Friars at ceremonies in New Jersey on August 22 and 23.

Presiding at the ceremonies held in the Franciscan Monastery Church of St. Bonaventure, Pateron, N. J., following Mass was the Very Rev. Thomas Plassmann, O.F.M., Minister Provincial of Holy Name Province.

Among 53 young men clothed with the habit of the Franciscan Order and received into the Novitiate were: John Richardson, Elmira, as Frater Remigius Francis; Robert Cronay, Rochester, as Frater Cronan Anthony; and William Keenan, Rochester, as Frater Malcolm Anthony.

One of nine Tertiary Brothers received into the Novitiate as members of Holy Name Province was Brother Norbert Christastio of Elmira.

Most recently the sister was honored by becoming the only nun ever admitted to practice law before the United States Supreme Court.

Work Among Catholics In Their Native Indo-China Set For 2 In Elmira Meeting

Paths of two young natives of Indo-China, one a Nazareth College student in this country to prepare themselves for working among their own people, crossed this week in Elmira. A Belgian priest of many years labor in their native country brought the meeting about.

Miss Pauline Nguyen-Minh of Saigon, French Indo-China came to Nazareth College in February to major in sociology. During the summer she has been spending her vacation as a nurse's aid at St. Joseph's Hospital in Elmira.

THROUGH THE Rev. Emmanuel Jacques, who is attached to the Vicariate Apostolic of Phat Diem in Tonkin province of the new republic of Vietnam of Indo-China, she met Dr. Emmanuel Ho Quan-Phuc, a dental surgeon of Saigon, her father being Monsieur Phan van Can, a health official there.

The young Nazareth College student when in France became interested in the Catholic Church but had not entered it when arriving at Nazareth. She increased her interest in the Catholic faith here and was received into the church the first Friday in May by the Rev. Dr. Edward J. Lintz of Nazareth College faculty this spring and was confirmed by His Excellency Bishop Kearney at the college, the first week in June.

Dr. Ho, who is in this country on the invitation of the State Department to complete three months of advanced study in dentistry at Georgetown University, is a third generation Catholic.

obtained at Taberd High School in Saigon, French Indo-China. Dr. Emmanuel Ho Quan-Phuc, a dentist studying advanced work at Georgetown University and Miss Pauline Nguyen-Minh, a Nazareth College sociology student meet for the first time in Elmira.

She is at Nazareth on a scholarship provided by the Catholic Federation in France and is one of six students now studying in this country through the Federation's efforts.

Reds Pressure Parents Against Religious Instructor

Hungarian parents have until September 15 to enroll their children for religious instruction in the State schools, according to a brief announcement in the press.

The announcement followed a campaign by mass organizations of the Workers (Communist) Party in which strong pressure was brought upon parents not to register their children for religious education classes.

AS A RESULT of this pressure the percentage of parents who asked for the religious instruction at a preliminary registration at the end of June is said to have dropped to a low figure, especially in Budapest.

A year ago, when religious instruction was first made optional in the schools, well over 90 per cent of Hungarian parents enrolled their children for religious classes.

IT HAS BEEN hunted in official circles here that a successful conclusion of the negotiations between representatives of the Roman Catholic hierarchy and the government for a Church State agreement would help the religious education situation greatly.

There is not a single Roman Catholic parochial school left in Hungary today. The Protestant Churches were able to retain a few of their high schools and colleges through agreements concluded with the State.

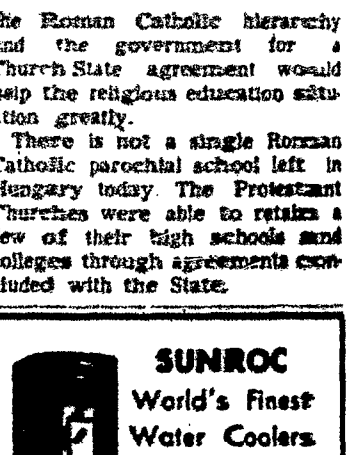
Representative groups from alumni chapters all over the United States are expected to attend this celebration.
