Work Among Catholics In Their Native Indo-China Set For 2 In Elmira Meeting

Paths of two young natives of Indo-China, one a Nazareth College student, in this country to prepare themselves for working among their own people, crossed this week in Elmira. A Belgian priest of many years labor in their native country brought the meeting about.

Miss Pauline Nguyen-Minh of Saigon, French Indo-China came to Nazareth College in February to major in sociology. During the summer she has been spending her vacation as a nurse's aid at St. Joseph's Hospital in Elmira.

THROUGH THE Rev. Emmanuel Jacques, who is attached to the Vicariate Apostolic of Phat Diem in Tonkin Province of the new republic of Vietnam of Indo-China, she met Dr. Emmanuel Ho Quan-Phuc, a dental surgeon of Saigon, Miss Minh is also of Saigon, her father being Monsieur Phan van Can, a health official there.

The young Nazareth College student when in France became interested in the Catholic Church but had not entered it when arriving at Nazareth. She increased her interest in the Catholic faith here and was received into the church the first Friday in May by the Rev. Dr. Edward J. Lutz of Nazareth College faculty in spring and was confirmed by His Excellency Bishop Kearney at the college, the first week in June.

Dr. Ho, who is in this country on the invitation of the State Department to complete three months of advanced study in dentistry at Georgetown University, is a third generation Catholic.

The work being done by Miss Minh at the Elmira hospital has been warmly praised by the entire staff and patients. She is performing duties to which she is unaccustomed but is persevering in the work and offering it to Jesus to ask His help and guidance for the people of my country in these trying times.

GREATLY DEVOTED to the Blessed Mother, she recites the Rosary daily and hopes "through the grade of God to bring my parents to the True Faith upon my return home."

Dr. Ho is planning on his return to his native country to continue his general practice and to aid in the work of the Catholic missions. He received his degree in dentistry in 1942 at Aurora College, Shanghai, and his graduation. His early education was

obtained at Tabred High School in Saigon, taught by the Christian Brothers of St. John Baptist de la Salle. He also studied English at LaSalle College at Hong Kong, conducted by those Brothers.

Miss Minh plans to enroll in a Catholic University to obtain her master's degree upon completion of her studies at Nazareth. She will then return to her home to work among her own people.

She is at Nazareth on a scholarship provided by the Catholic Federation in France and is one of six students now studying in this country through the Federation's efforts.

In her own country, Miss Minh was educated under the Canons of St. Augustine at Notre Dame Dulang Bien in DaLat, Vietnam.

On Oct. 15 the members of the Cleveland Diocesan and San Diego Diocesan Holy Year Pilgrimages will be present for the Beatification of Venerable Marie Javouhey, founder of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Cluny. The convent of the Sisters of the Good Shepherd and Mt. St. Rose School have been purchased for this purpose. The transaction was completed by the Very Rev. Edward L. Hughes, O.P., Provincial of the St. Albert the Great Province of the Dominican Order, Chicago.

The seminary will be known as St. Rose of Lima House of Studies and will provide a four year course of theology and training for Dominican candidates for the priesthood. A post-graduate school of theology will be added at a later date.
