Sam Urzetta, U.S. Amateur Golf Champ Started Sports Career at St. Jerome's

Sam Urzetta, the nation's champion amateur golfer, returned to his East Rochester home this week as the most respected and lavishly praised Catholic sport star in the history of the Rochester Diocese.

Victor over Frank Stranahan, son of a Toledo millionaire and present British Amateur champion in a dramatic 39 hole final match of the U. S. Amateur in Minneapolis last Saturday, the smiling Italian had captivated sports critics and ordinary fans in every section of the country.

His 11 under par record for the week's tournament was a testimony no less widely than his genial modesty of character.

SON OF Mr. and Mrs. Sam Urzetta, 320 West Elm St., East Rochester, and a life-long member of St. Jerome's parish there, the new champion is a 1950 graduate of St. Bonaventure University where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree as a History Major.

Not a brilliant student but a "heavy plunger," according to his Franciscan teachers there, Sammie held his scholastic marks while playing four years of basketball with the Bona cagers and starting as captain on the golf team. He was co-captain of the basketball team for two seasons and won the NCAA free throw title in the 47-49 seasons.

THE ST. JEROME'S parish Youth Center, now the Community Youth Center, was taking this week for the beginning of Sammie's sport skill. He "practically lived there" one friend said when the parish youth program took over a downtown hall in the late 30's for

basketball court and game room. Nick Urzetta, Sam's older brother, was the director when the club was organized by the parish Holy Name Society and Sammie earned a place on the club's basketball and baseball teams. He played for St. Jerome's in the Parochial Schools Basketball League for several winters.

As a member of the parish high school pupils' choir, the new champ also starred in the St. Jerome's choir loft at Sunday

Mass during his high school days. During the summers of 1948-49, Sammie with more than 100 other East Rochester boys took over Camp Stella Maria, diocesan boys' camp on Corcoran Lake. For one week instruction that old counselors still remember with awe.

The camp taught Sam to swim and polished up his baseball talents but as one former counselor, now a priest, recalled, "even then he was swinging a golf club like a pro."

GUARANTEED A place on next spring's Walker Cup golf team which will travel to Great Britain for international matches, Sam will also draw an invitation to play in the nation's most exclusive competition, the Masters' Tournament held annually in Atlanta, Georgia. For the rest of his playing days he will be eligible for the National Amateur without a qualification test.

Affable, gentlemanly, conscientious, the new amateur king was described by one sports writer as "a great natural athlete who has flowing power, great timing and a cold calculating competitive approach."

James S. Smith, president of the United States Golf Association declared: "Sam Urzetta is the finest amateur to come along since the last war, and I don't know of any better player before that."

His future aspiration is simple, but a reflection of his confidence and ambition: "The next title I want to bring to Rochester is the National Open golf championship."

Catholic Hour Plans 4 Dramas

Washington—(NC)—A special series of four drama-documentary programs entitled "Opera Survival" and designed to expose the evils of communism will be presented on the Catholic Hour radio program during September. It has been announced here by the National Council of Catholic Men, producer of the program.

The Catholic Hour is broadcast by NBC each Sunday from 6 to 6:30 p.m. and is heard in the Rochester Diocese only through WCRN, Buffalo.

THE SCRIPTS for the series are being written by Robert C. Healy. He is the author of the play "Snake Hands With The Devil," dealing with the trial of 11 top communists in the United States, which was produced by the New York Blackfriars' Guild in the fall of 1949.

The series will be developed under four sub-titles. The first, "Spectre Over Europe," will trace the development of Marxian philosophy from its beginning up to the Russian revolution. The second, "The Giant Is Harnessed," will portray the development of communism in Soviet Russia under the direction of Josef Stalin. The third, "Now The World," will deal with the growth of communism in its quest for world domination.

Film Stars Aid Many Causes For Good, Actress Reports

New York—(NC)—Hollywood is increasingly aware of its special responsibilities to do good, Loretta Young reported in the first Catholic Hour broadcast ever to feature an actress as a witness.

Asking "What is the actor doing to carry the message of God to the masses when it has come to be heard?" she said that stars have appeared regularly on the Family Theatre radio program.

"Have you seen the short motion picture called 'You Can Change the World'?" Miss Young continued.
