The capable presiding by Monsignor Edward A. Freking, national CSMC secretary over the various meetings, the varied papers on discussion of mission problems, and the entertainment program provided for all who attended were praised by the delegates.

SOLEMN PONTIFICAL Mass, the Mass of St. Louis, the Crusader, formally opened the sessions in the Navy Drill Hall, Celorant was Blahop John F. Noll of Fort Wayne. Sermon was preached by the Rev. Xavier S. Thani Nayagam, of the Diocese of Tuticorin, South India.

Sessions and panel meetings covered the mission work of the church in China, India, Pakistan, Korea and in the home missions in the United States. Particularly impressive to the delegates was the Rosary procession from the drill hall to the grotto in back of Sacred Heart Church on the College campus. Each participant carried a lighted candle and answered the prayers as they came over the P.A. system. Solemn Benediction was imparted at the Grotto.

The jubilarian is Sister Jane LeFrois, S.S.P. S., whose early education was received at Sacred Heart Academy, Rochester.

IN THE CHAPEL adorned in silver simplicity, Sister Jane renewed her vows on July 6. The ceremony was conducted by His Excellency, the Most Rev. A. A. Noser, S.V.D., assisted by the Rev. Charles G. Erb, S.V.D., whose home, also in Rochester.

Two other Missionary Sister Servants of the Holy Ghost made their final profession at the ceremony before Holy Mass. Sister Maryclare and Sister Gerard.

A group of the native school children sang Latin and vernacular songs during the Mass and for the Benediction following.

Throughout the day the children joined in the celebration. Junior and senior girls vied with one another in presenting original skills and songs. Entertainers were rewarded with a tea party which ended in their being given a half holiday.

SEVERAL TIMES during the day Sister Jane was seen delving through the pile of mail that had poured in from across the sea. Letters, beautiful cards, donations, gifts, all made her wish, she said that time was not a thief, so that she could answer each benefactor individually.

The Jubilarian expressed her deep gratitude to those on this side of the ocean for their thoughtfulness which added to her joy, "benefitted the mission, and made her grateful to the good God who gave her so many friends and relatives after the pattern of His own generosity."

Sister has sent "a hearty God Bless You" to all who remembered her.
