Funeral services for Mrs. Miles W. McDonnell, Sr., were conducted by her son, the Rev. Joseph M. McDonnell, pastor of St. Gabriel's Church, Hammondsport, on Saturday, August 26. 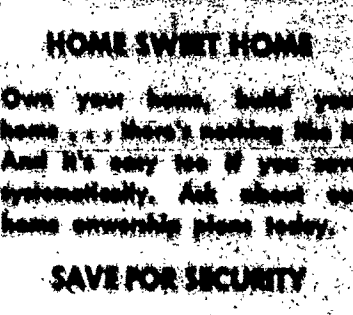

20,000 Visit NCCS Rome Club
Rome—(NC)—During the first six months of Holy Year almost 20,000 American pilgrims visiting Rome have availed themselves of the services of the American Catholic Club, operated by the National Catholic Community Service, a member agency of the Associated Services for the Armed Forces.
Of this number approximately two-thirds were military personnel, arriving either on organized tours or as individual pilgrims. From all of the posts in Germany as well as stations in England, the U.S., Tripoli, Greece, Turkey, Austria, Paris and the Azores. Others came from American embassy and legation offices in Sweden, Iran, Bagdad and Moscow.
