Catholic Gives Life, Three Wounded In Korea Fighting

One Catholic serviceman has been killed and three wounded according to reports from the Defense department. Casualties listed in the Korean fighting are:

Master Sgt. John A. Cahill, 26, formerly of 187 Mildred St., was killed August 13, according to word received by his mother, Mrs. A. M. Cahill, Columbus Civic Center.

Sergeant Cahill was with the 9th Regimental Combat Team, 2nd Infantry Division. He re-enlisted in 1948 and served as an instructor at Fort Benning, Ga., before he was sent to Fort Lewis, Washington.

He received the Silver Star for rescuing a Chinese despite heavy Japanese fire. He was also awarded the Bronze Star.

Born in Rochester, Cahill was graduated from Victor High School. He attended Brockport State Teachers College before he entered the Army in World War II and again after the war.

Surviving besides his mother are a sister, Mrs. C. Richard Timmel, Miami, Fla.; an aunt, Mrs. Russell Howe; a cousin, Ellen Howe; and his grandmother, Mrs. Nellie Long, all of 90 Mayfield St., Hamilton.

Marine Pfc. Harold L. Rindan, 21, son of Mrs. Mary A. Rindan of 408 Lake Avenue, and a former Aquinas Institute student, was reported wounded on August 17. Rindan enlisted in the Marine Corps in August, 1948, and was sent to the Marine base at Guam three months later. He was stationed there until May, 1950, when he came home for a four-day furlough. He sailed from the United States for Korea on July 14.

Pfc. Patsy Gaudin, Jr., 18, son of Patsy Gaudin Sr., 40 Jones Ave., was wounded by a hand grenade August 14, according to a letter he wrote to his father. Gaudin enlisted April 2, 1949. He attended St. Anthony's School and Paul Rogers Trade School.

Patsy wrote that his wound had occurred while his company was charging to retake a hill from which they had been driven a short while before.

2 Masses Open Services In West Webster Church

More than 600 persons inspected the newest Catholic church in the diocese last weekend when two Masses celebrated Sunday, Sept. 3, signaled the opening of St. Rita's Church, West Webster.

The Rev. Francis A. Kiehammer, first pastor, pointed out that the first Mass was celebrated just 4 1/2 months after work on the church building began. Formal dedication ceremonies will be held later in the fall.

Celebrant of the first of the two Masses was the Rev. Arthur F. Florack, pastor of St. Michael's Church, Rochester, who was instrumental in purchasing the 23-acre West Webster property and in aiding in construction of the church building.

Two Masses will be offered each Sunday at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. in the wood-frame building, which will seat 500 persons. During construction of a new rectory beside the church, slated for completion in mid-October, Father Kiehammer has made his temporary headquarters in a large rear-room of the church. Work is continuing on reconstruction of a large barn on the property into a parish hall.
