Germans To Get Assumption Pastoral

Fulda, Germany (RNS) — A pastoral letter dealing with the dogma of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary, which will be proclaimed on Nov. 1 by Pope Pius XII, will be issued shortly by the Roman Catholic hierarchy of Germany.

This announcement was made here by Joseph Cardinal Frings, Archbishop of Cologne, following the annual meeting of the hierarchy. Cardinal Frings presided over the meeting.
