

Priest Fights Grasshopper Plague

ROCHESTER, N. Y. (NC) —The Rev. James Ryan of Campion College has been carrying on research work for the past 12 years which he hopes will rid Canada of the annual grasshopper plague which takes a heavy toll of prairie crops. Mr. Ryan is developing a fungus which destroys the grasshoppers and which can be spread quickly among them any time they threaten to assume plague proportions. The fungus which he has developed is not harmful to other forms of animal life.

(Continued from Page 1) color of the flowers, under a canopy borne by four-pair processions of the Holy Name Union.

Uniformed marchers will form a double line on the field, with drawn swords, through which the remainder of the procession will proceed. With exception of the principals, who will proceed to the altar for the enthronement of the Sacred Host, the marchers will take seats on the field. The "O Salutaris Hostia" hymn will be sung by the entire assemblage.

After recitation of the Rosary, to be begun by Bishop Kearney with each decade to be led by a member of a religious order, the Bishop will give three meditations on the Blessed Sacrament.

During the hymn, "Sweet Name Which Makes the Dying Live," the stadium lights will be dimmed and the entire assembly will light candles. Recitation of the Holy Name Pledge will be led by the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, spiritual director of the Holy Name Union.

Following solemn Benediction and the Divine Praises will be the singing of the national anthem and two verses of "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name." Candles then will be extinguished and the procession will re-form to escort the Blessed Sacrament from the grounds back to the chapel at the Annex.

ENSHRINED NEAR the top

of the high arch on the altar will be a statue of Christ, rosettes; at each "Hall Mary" of the Rosary, a rose will be lighted. Other colored lighting effects at the base of the altar will accompany the recitation of the "Our Fathers."

Six hundred men from parish Holy Name Societies throughout Monroe County will serve as puffers. Kites containing candles and candle holders, and programs will be distributed at the nine entrances to the stadium.

Father Flynn will handle spiritual aspects of the ceremony. President Daniel E. Macken of the Diocesan Union was appointed Vicepresident Martin Q. Moll as general chairman of arrangements.

Urban G. Kress is chairman of ushers, assisted by division leaders Leo F. Zeller, Robert

H. Kath, Sylvester Englert and John W. Deguz. Police Chief James O. Stein of Webster heads the procession committee. Candle distribution will be handled by a committee under Frank J. Lane and John T. Nothnagle. In charge of the grounds committee is Jack Hedges, with Albert F. Smith heading the program committee.

Pope Cites Moral Aspects of Smoking

Rome—(RNS)—Moral aspects of smoking were stressed by Pope Pius XII during an audience given at his summer palace in Castel Gandolfo to 200 delegates attending an international tobacco congress here.

The Pontiff, who does not smoke, told tobacco men from 24 European and seven non-European countries that "polluting and other accidents, which too often affect the general health of organs of smokers, must be cut down to a minimum."

"It is the duty of all to watch and regulate the use of tobacco in such a manner," he said, "that it harmonizes with the exigencies of physical and moral health, the economic possibilities and the social obligations of individuals and peoples."

Five minutes, or more often if needed. Titled "Aquinas Stadium," they will operate through the following streets:

Originating at Franklin and Main Street, through Main to State to Lake to Driving Park to Dewey to Ridgeway.

Originating at Portland and Clifford Avenues, through Carter to Norton to St. Paul to Ridge Road to Dewey to Ridgeway.

ADDED BUS service, the committee pointed out, will make it possible for persons driving their own cars to park them some blocks from the stadium, if they desire, and to board the special buses for the remainder of the trip.

Persons using the special buses are advised to note the number on the bus and to board the same vehicle immediately after the ceremony for the return trip.

Abp. O'Hara Welcomed Home

Atlanta, Ga.—(NC)—After four stern years behind the iron curtain, Archbishop Gerald P. O'Hara, Bishop of Savannah Atlanta, returned here to receive a warm, traditional Dixie welcome.

In connection with the homecoming, Gov. Herman Tammadge of Georgia, issued a proclamation setting the day aside as "Archbishop Gerald P. O'Hara Day," marking the first time that such an honor had been accorded to anyone in the state.

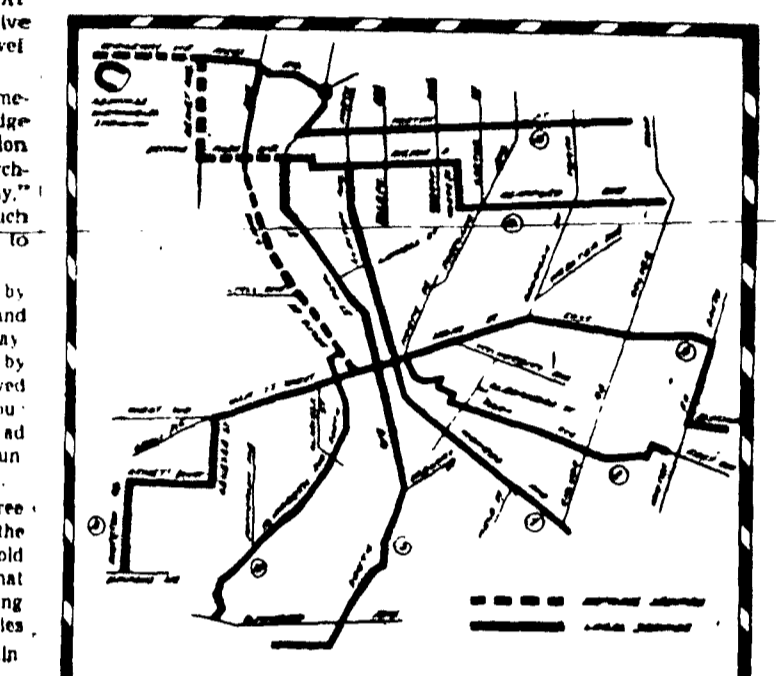
The Archbishop was met by Mayor William B. Hartfield and a committee of priests and laymen. He was accompanied by Magr. John C. Kirk who served as his secretary during the four years that he was Regent ad interim at the Apostolic Nunciature in Bucharest, Rumania.

"It's wonderful to be in a free country again and to breathe free air," the Archbishop told Mayor Hartfield. He added that communism destroys everything it touches and that all liberties are dead behind the iron curtain. Workers and farmers who are supposed to have benefited from communism now are enslaved, he declared.
