Men's, Women's Division Leaders Picked By CYA

Two veteran campaigners have been named to head the Men's and Women's Divisions in the forthcoming membership drive of the Columbus Youth Association.

They are Miss Shirley Simpson and Ray B. Welch. Both have served on previous CYA drives with success. Miss Simpson was chairman of the Women's Division last year while Welch has served as a divisional leader with the Men's Division for a number of years.

Selection of Miss Simpson and Welch completes the lineup of campaign leaders for the drive which will begin with a dinner in the auditorium of the Columbus Civic Center on Thursday, October 5 and continue through Tuesday, October 17.

A graduate of the class of 1939, an outstanding athlete and an honor student, the Rev. Joseph O. Tierney, C.S.C., the recipient of the financial aid which he said will be used in paying his passage to his India post in the middle of October.

FATHER TIERNEY celebrated his first Solemn Mass at Blessed Sacrament Church, Rochester on Sunday, June 11 following his ordination at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, D. C. on June 6. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Tierney of Hayside Long Island, both formerly of Rochester.

As a member of the Aquinas football squad he starred at half back in the first game against Catholic Central High School of Detroit in 1938. He attained fame on the track squad and served as a class officer in his Senior Year.

The amount given the young missionary is a part of the record sum raised at Aquinas during the 1949-1950 year under the direction of the Rev. Arthur C. Looby, C.S.B., director of missions at the school.

Father Tierney will leave for his India post in the middle of October.
