

Trappist Monk Of Rochester To Be Ordained

Ordination of a Trappist monk from Rochester—the Rev. M. Stephen (Donald) King, O.C.S.O., a 1927 graduate of Corpus Christi School—will take place Saturday, Sept. 23, in the Basilica of St. Nicholas, Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada.

Father King received the habit of the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance on Feb. 25, 1934 at the Abbey of Our Lady of the Valley, Valley Falls, N. Y.

He took his final and solemn vows in 1936, and on Sept. 8 of this year made his promise of stability to the Priory of Our Lady of the Prairies near Winnipeg.

Father King has two brothers, Robert W. King, 44 Lawton St., Rochester, and Charles W. King, formerly of Rochester, now living in Lahoma. His parents died when he was young, and he was cared for by an aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. Bert Cable, 1 Carleton St., Rochester.

Planning to attend the ordination is a Rochester friend, Mrs. Daniel Traversa, 135 Windermere Rd., who is donating the chalice to be used for the priest-monk's first Mass. The donation was made in memory of her only son, killed nearly two years ago in an auto crash near Westport. Father King studied at Holy Cross College, Dunkirk, before entering the Trappist Order. Last year ill health forced him to take a six-month leave of absence from the Rhode Island abbey, much of it spent in hospitals in
