Owego Parishioners Await Opening Of New School

Owego — People of Owego are invited to visit the new St. Patrick's School to be opened Sunday, Sept. 24 from 3 p.m. to 9 p.m. and from 9 p.m. to 9 p.m. according to the Rev. Joseph A. Hogan, assistant pastor of St. Patrick's Church writing for "The Owego Gazette."

The new school at 309 Front St. will accommodate more than 150 students. Part of the school includes the old Stanbrough mansion but "it is as modern as the most modern school."

The opening day will be especially appropriate for the Sisters of Mercy who staff the school because it is "Our Lady of Mercy Day." It will be a day of thanksgiving for them—a far cry from the first structure of 1860.

It was on a Friday in January, 1860, when five Sisters of Mercy came to Owego to teach the children of St. Patrick's parish. Father Hogan's article recalls. These "Angels of Mercy" have completed nearly 100 years of service in their mission in Owego. Their graduates are over the face of the earth and their number is legion.

The convent in the beginning was their school. As the parish grew, they saw the old frame church become part of their school. This building, dating from 1840, still forms the second story of the present school.

About 1910, Mgr. George V. Burns, present rector of the Pro-Cathedral in Rochester, raised the old school building to place two more class rooms beneath it. Thus it has remained over the years.

The new school is unique in a sense, too, because the beauty of the home has not been lost. There you will still see the magnificent fire-places in the modern class-
