

Physically Handicapped To Visit Father Baker Shrine

Lackawanna — Fifth annual pilgrimage of physically-handicapped persons to Father Baker's National Shrine and Basilica of Our Lady of Victory, Lackawanna, on Sunday, Oct. 8, will highlight the fall novena in honor of the Most Holy Rosary and Our Lady of Victory in the famous Shrine.

The pilgrimage will be sponsored jointly by the Catholic Guild for the Blind and the Catholic Daughters of America, Court Timon, 835, Buffalo.

Special Novena services for the handicapped will start at 4 p.m., and will consist of recitation of the Litany of Our Lady of Victory for the special intentions of all present within the Shrine, as well as the sick, shut-ins and convalescents unable to be present in the Shrine in person.

This October Novena will start on Sunday, Oct. 1, instead of the usual Saturday, and conclude on Monday, Oct. 9, instead of the usual Sunday.

IN ANNOUNCING the change of the starting and closing dates of the novena, Rev. Joseph M. McPherson, superintendent of Father Baker's Homes of Charity, believes that more people will be enabled to attend the opening services which will be a strong incentive to continue the novena until the closing.

"We urge those who wish to be remembered in the prayers of all those making the coming novena to send us their petitions as soon as possible," Father McPherson suggests. "These petitions will be placed on Our Lady's altar in the Shrine, just before the Novena opens and will remain there throughout the entire nine days of special prayer."

The novena will open at the 10:30 Mass on Sunday, Oct. 1, and close with services at 7:45, Monday evening, Oct. 9. The novena Mass is at 9:00 daily, followed by a brief sermon.

Both Father McPherson and Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph E. Maguire, pastor of the Shrine and Basilica, extend a cordial invitation to all to attend the novena at the Shrine in person or, if this is physically impossible, to make the novena in their own parish church, or at home.

Novena officials suggest that all handicapped persons, relatives and friends planning to attend the Oct. 8 pilgrimage, call Francis Van Elch, Shrine Religious Code Studio director, WO 1612, of their intentions.

Due to the over-capacity attendance that is expected, seating and other arrangements must be made well in advance. Handicapped persons who lack transportation will be provided with same provided request is made sufficiently ahead of time.
