### Doctrine Congress Calls Diocesans To Syracuse

The record attendance anticipated at the Third Provincial Congress of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine in Syracuse, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 6, 7 and 8 will include a large Rochester diocese delegation according to the Rev. Albert J. Schnack, diocesan director of the Confraternity.

The Congress is under the patronage of the Cardinal Archbishop and Bishops of the Province of New York. The host is Bishop Walter A. Foran of Syracuse, formerly of Rochester. His Excellency Bishop Kearney will be among 10 Bishops who will honor a luncheon for priests in Hotel Syracuse on Friday, Oct. 6, at 12:30 p.m. A special educational address will be given by Bishop Raymond A. Lane, M. M. of Maryknoll.

OF INTEREST to Rochester diocesans will be a Solemn Pontifical Mass in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, to be celebrated by Bishop David J. Cunningham, Auxiliary of Syracuse, for the first time. Bishop Cunningham is a graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary. Preacher will be the Rev. Dr. Maynard Connell, rector of St. Andrew's Seminary, Rochester.

General headquarters of the three-day meeting will be at the Hotel Syracuse, with sessions also at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception and Cathedral High School. The Confraternity Directors of the State have arranged a practical program for the Syracuse Congress to carry out the objectives of the Confraternity: religious education of the public school child; parent education; and the apostolate of the church. His Excellency Bishop Kearney said in a letter to priests this week.

Special sessions, demonstrations and exhibits have been planned for Priests, Sisters and the laity.
