"I figured the good Lord will help those who are charitable. We will manage, even if I have to split my own meals with them. I'm sure the son will soon find work."

The younger Zama, 43, is a painter, sculptor and copper-smith. He is one of the few artists in the world who can paint a portrait in wax, said Mr. McCarthy.
