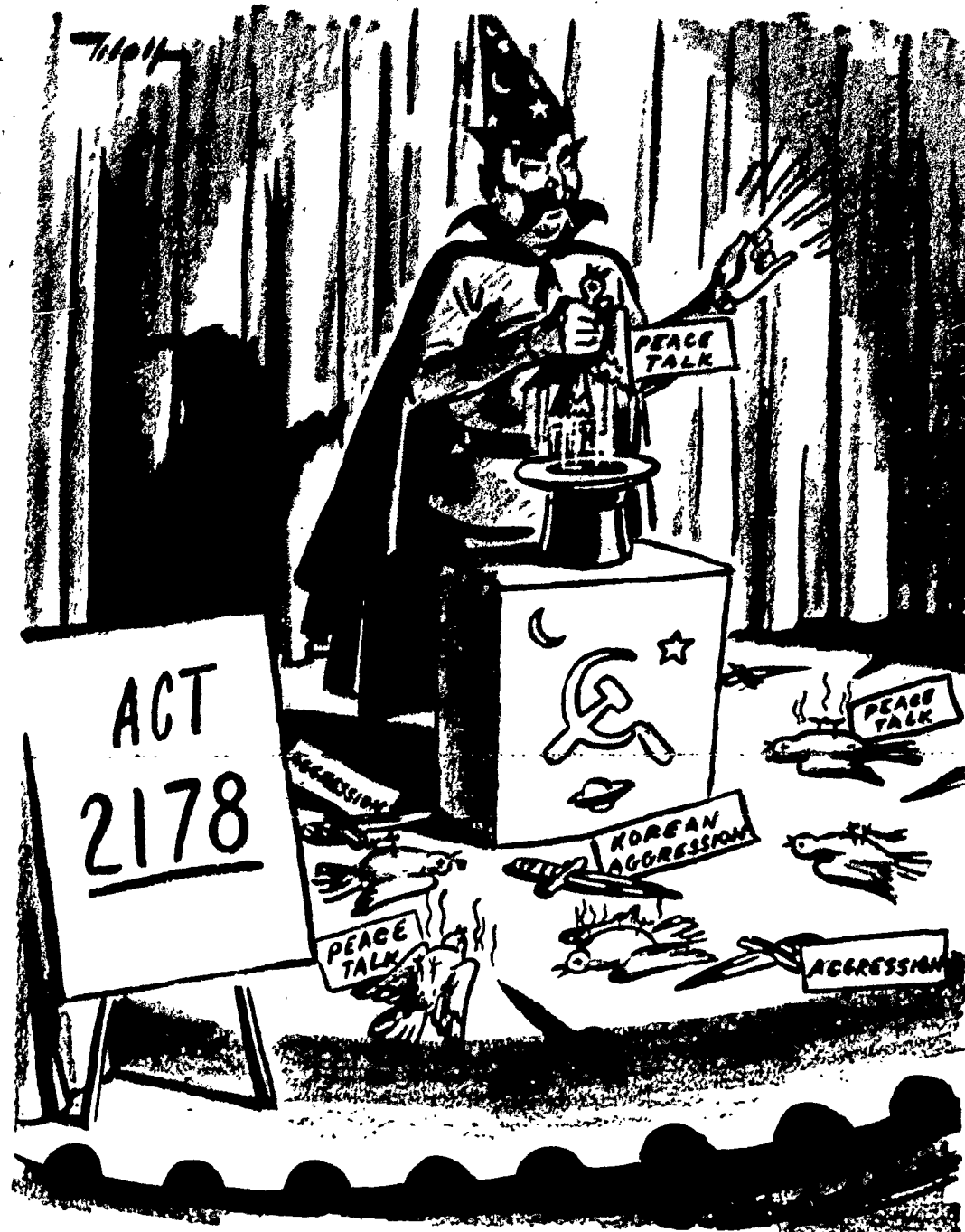

MSGR. SHEEN WRITES... The Sponge Has Holes

Discord would not offend our ears if there were not a standard of perfect harmony against which to judge all sounds. In the same way, the existence of evil is an argument for the existence of God...

WHEN WE examine our own hearts, we discover a further argument for God's necessity. We are all like sponges—filled with holes. For a sponge is a mixture of being and non-being...

Evil is thus a kind of parasite on goodness. If there were no good by which to measure things, evil could not exist. Men sometimes forget this, and say, "There is so much evil in the world that there cannot be a God."

COMMUNISTS frequently fall into the error against logic of forgetting that "bad" implies the existence of "good." They deny the existence of God and admit only "historical determinism."

THE DEFENSE Production Act of 1939 is a complicated piece of legislation much more complicated than its 1942 counterpart. In the new law, stabilization can be voluntary or compulsory and if compulsory may be applied to one industry or to all industries.

Because of the rigidity of this law, labor unions are now out to close the gap between the wages of their members and the prices they have to pay for goods.

Are We in Another 'Boom-Bust' Cycle?

Your milk, shoes, homes and automobiles are more expensive today than they were on June 1st. Most likely the prices for these and other items in your family budget will remain stable and may even decline in the next few weeks. The explanation for the ups and downs of the price cycle in these past four months may be found in the Korean War.

Even when the Korean War is finally over, the problem of inflation will still be with us. Foreign commitments, a huge military budget, payments on World War II debts, and defense production will all aggravate the situation.

THE ANSWER is not at all difficult. Many businessmen raised prices immediately after the war started merely out of greed. Wages, competition for manpower, scarcity of goods at such a time it is most profitable to raise prices.
