Nuns Served In Epidemic At Mt. Morris

St. Morris. — The Sisters of St. Joseph, living and deceased, who have served St. Patrick's parish since 1912 were honored here Sunday, October 8 when the Rev. Thomas F. Brennan, pastor of St. Patrick's, offered the 9 o'clock Mass for them.

Celebrating the 300th anniversary of the founding of the order some 20 nuns of the order from the neighboring convents attended the Mass in a body with the nuns of St. Patrick's Convent and were entertained at dinner at the convent.

In the afternoon they inspected St. Patrick's School that was opened in 1912 by the Rev. Andrew E. Breen, D.D. who was pastor of St. Patrick's at that time.

THE NAMES of the first nuns to come to Mt. Morris were: Sister Sebastian, Sister Alcantara, Sister Cyprian, Sister Aurelia, Sister Odilia, and Sister Gerald Magalla.

During the influenza epidemic of World War I the sisters endeavored themselves to the people of Mt. Morris when they volunteered to care for those stricken by the plague.

Sister Francis Xavier, contracted the disease from contact with the sick, and died.

The principal work of the Sisters of St. Joseph throughout their years in Mt. Morris has been as members of the faculty of St. Patrick's School on Stanley Street.

Goal By Tuesday Sought By 300 CYA Workers

You are building a generation of people who will be worth while whom we can be proud of and who will be a credit to their God and country.

This was the opening message given workers by the Excellency Bishop Kearney in the Columbus Youth Association 19th annual membership campaign which will be brought to a close on Oct. 17 in Columbus Civic Center.

A report meeting was scheduled for last night on Monday night at a dinner meeting the 300 workers in a quest for 2,500 members reported 663 members.

IN SOUNDING the keynote of the drive the Bishop who is honorary chairman stressed the preventative, the CYA as a character building agency is against juvenile delinquency.

"We are shocked at the ruthless and malicious attitude of some youths in the things they do," the Bishop said. "This is largely a matter of the home where they should get the foundations of discipline, respect for law and order and the fear of God."

Recreation is put alone the Bishop said to divert youth from delinquency "It is not sufficient

to keep the mob the streets, not sufficient enough to furnish them with a place to recreate. They must be under the supervision of trained recreation workers.

"Then they can learn to play according to the rules and develop a sense of cooperation. Then they can play the game with proper respect toward the feelings of others."

General chairman of the drive Daniel E. Macken at the opening dinner said, "Somewhere in town there is a kid relying on you to help him get the benefits of the CYA."
