13,000 Clothing Workers Get Raise

Approximately 13,000 employees of six large and a number of small Rochester clothing manufacturers will receive a 12 1/2-cent hourly wage increase Nov. 20.

They are members of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, whose latest wage agreement with the Clothing Manufacturers Association, announced jointly Oct. 10 in New York City, covers 150,000 workers throughout the nation.

Although it is the first wage boost in the industry since 1947, there have been substantial improvements in social welfare and retirement benefits since that year, the announcement states. "The record of labor-management relations in the industry," the announcement declared, "demonstrates anew that both parties meet to solve problems - not to win arguments. The parties congratulate each other for this continued outlook which presages industrial peace and cooperation for a great many years to come."
