Story of European Shrines Told At Geneva KC Dinner

Geneva—Religious shrines were described in an illustrated lecture Thursday by Rev. John Norris, assistant pastor of St. Mary's church, Auburn, at the Columbus Day dinner of the Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus. The event was held in Geneva Lake Country club. Twenty-five couples attended.
Father Norris told of his Holy Year pilgrimage to Rome this summer. He also visited Lourdes and the shrine of Fatima in Portugal.

Mass Offered for Korea Victim

A Solemn Memorial Funeral Mass will be offered at St. Andrew's Church, Saturday, November 11 at 9 o'clock in the repose of the soul of Pfc. Raymond Mathony, 425 Clinton Ave., South, that her only son was killed in Korea on Sept. 16, the day the United Nations Forces landed on Inchon.
In his last letter written on board ship bound for Korea, Mathony wrote "there is Mass every day. I have missed Mass three times. Everybody gets religious over here. I found in the past that it helps a great deal to have faith in God. We had Mass Sunday and I received Holy Communion."
Pfc. Mathony had a long service record. Prior to World War II he enlisted in the United States Army and served for four years. In November 1942 he enlisted in the Marines for another four years. When he returned he was hospitalized at the Batavia Veterans Hospital for two months.
Later he became a member of the Rochester Police Force serving for two and a half years. Early this year he resigned from the force and re-enlisted in the Marines.
Pfc. David G. Shaughnessy, 19 son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank G. Shaughnessy, 792 Post Ave. was wounded in action in the Korean War, Sept. 27.
Shaughnessy was hospitalized at the Batavia Veterans Hospital in Korea to tell them he had been wounded slightly by shrapnel. In his last letter to his parents dated Oct. 2 he said he expected to be returned to active duty Oct. 2.
The paratrooper enlisted in the Army 2 1/2 years ago. He was first sent to Korea from Japan after completing his basic training. He was given a three day furlough at the end of July and was sent to the Korean Front for the second time.
Shaughnessy attended St. Monica's School, West High School and Edison Technical High School.
