

### Athletic Field Completed By Seneca Falls Knights

Seneca Falls—Seneca Falls Council, Knights of Columbus, have completed work on the athletic field adjoining the Knights' home on West Bayard Street. Work on this project was begun in the Spring of 1949 under the supervision of Grand Knight Henry Simolo and the Council has spent about a thousand dollars to bring the property to its present condition.

A barn, at the rear of the property was removed, several large trees uprooted, brush taken out and the ground leveled off.

A 100-foot football and baseball field now exists and during the past summer the Seneca Falls Softball League played their tournament there, providing recreation and entertainment for many people.

St. Patrick's Panthers Football Team is now using the field for their practice and games and St. Patrick's Panthers Baseball team just brought to a close a successful season.

Plans underway at the present time by the Council include the erection of an ornamental iron fence around the entire property owned by the Knights, and the reconstruction of the third floor of the home for the accommodation of Troop 80, Boy Scouts of America, which Troop the Council sponsors.

The Scouts will hold their meetings and conduct their activities on the third floor of the K of C. home as soon as work is completed.
