

# Marian Groups To March On Eve Of Dogma Rites; Japanese Bishops Attend Proclamation

Rome — (NC) — A gigantic Marian procession on the evening of October 31 will crown the labors of two international Marian congresses here and south.

The procession will be a magnificent one, with a statue of the Madonna and Child, and a host of other religious figures. The procession will start at the Vatican at 8 o'clock and will end at the Basilica of St. Peter's at midnight.

## Pontiff Composes Assumption Prayer

Vatican City — (NC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII has personally composed a prayer for Our Lady's Assumption. It will be distributed for recitation for the first time on November 1, the day of the proclamation of the dogma of the Assumption, according to the Vatican Office of Information.

## Prelates To Attend Oriental Rites

Cairo, Egypt — (NC) — The Oriental Church, will be well represented at the proclamation of the dogma of the Assumption at Rome on November 1. The Catholic Patriarchs of the Armenian, Syrian, Coptic, Byzantine, Chaldean and Latin Rites will be present, as well as a large number of other Oriental prelates.

## Pope Pius X Cause Advanced

Rome — (NC) — The cause for the beatification of Pope Pius X has moved another step forward with a preparatory session of the Sacred Congregation of Rites discussing medals proposed as a reward for the 19th-century Pontiff.

Tokyo — (NC) — Bishops Dominic Fukukori and Paul Yamaguchi of Fukuoka and Nagasaki are in Rome on a Holy Year and ad limina visit there. They will represent Japan at the solemn proclamation of the dogma of the Assumption on November 1.

Bishop Fukukori is known to thousands of non-Christian Japanese because of his zealous work in behalf of the handicapped and underprivileged classes.

WHEN THE Association for the Handicapped was established last May, several of the organizers, feeling there was need for spiritual guidance in the movement, asked Bishop Fukukori to assume the direction in the phase of the work. There are 20,000 active members in the association.

Bishop Fukukori has lectured extensively to various local groups and on such occasions invariably appeared in his episcopal robes since he found that the people preferred to have it that way. He also directed some members of his own staff to visit various groups for follow-up lectures of Catholic doctrine. This is all the more significant since only one of the towns visited so far has a Catholic mission of its own.

ONE TOWN HAS asked the Bishop to build a church and he is planning to celebrate a Pontifical Mass in the open there after his return from Rome. In another town almost the entire population of 15,000 turned out for the Bishop's lecture.

## Ministerial Group Opposes New Catholic High School

St. John, N. B. (RNS) — Opposition to the construction of a Roman Catholic high school here was expressed by the Ministerial Association of this district.

The Protestant clergymen claimed in a statement that the laws of New Brunswick forbid the building of sectarian or separate schools, but that this prohibition has been disregarded by the local school board and Catholic Church authorities for many years.

COPIES OF the ministers' statement were distributed at church services in the Protestant churches of St. John and suburbs.

The statement not only condemned the erection of the new St. Malachi's High School for boys, but also plans of the school board to rent the new school, construction of which will be started when demolition of old St. Malachi's boys' school on the site is completed.

## Germany Again Sends Missionaries

Bonn, Germany — (NC) — Germany has sent 547 new missionaries into mission fields since 1945 according to the publication "The Catholic Missions here." Of these 139 are priests, 32 Brothers and 376 Sisters. Most of them went to Africa, especially South Africa, while others went to India, Japanese and Negro missions in the Americas.

Before the war there were 8,109 Germans in actual mission fields including Austrians. It is estimated that death and illness has cut their number to 7,500.

## Anglican Vicar Becomes Catholic

London — (NC) — The Rev. P. W. Bayley, Church of England, Vicar of Woodlands in Dorsetshire, has resigned his post and become a Catholic. He was ordained 14 years ago and is a married man with four children.

# Americans Present Addresses In Rome

Rome — (NC) — A particularly successful American session of the International Mariological Congress opened at the pontifical Lateran University here this week.

The large hall was crowded with hundreds of American priests, seminarians and members of the American colony in Rome, who enthusiastically received papers written by American theologians and lay leaders. Archbishop Leo Binz, Coadjutor of Dubuque, who attended the session, gave the final word and benediction.

THE PAPER written by His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, sounded the keynote for this American theological gathering, stating "The American writers who are privileged to represent their nation in this world-wide tribute to the Blessed Virgin happily have chosen to discuss with the Church teachers on Our Lady's queenship." The Archbishop added that, "in our age of crisis and impending doom, wisely do we turn to the woman boldly foretold in the first days of our race."

Quoting from Genesis, he continued: "The serpent that would seduce, poison and paralyze the world once again lies in wait for the woman's heel... by Divine decree she will conquer that great red dragon... the ancient serpent, he who is called the devil, and Satan who leads astray the whole world." (Apocalypse XII).

THE UNITED STATES meeting of the congress was organized and conducted under the auspices of the Mariological Society of America. The Rev. Joseph C. Fenton of the Catholic University of America, secretary of the Society, assisted by the Rev. Wilfrid Hurley, of the Paulist Fathers, rector of the Church of Santa Susanna here, organized the session.

Father Hurley presided at today's session, which, in addition to the paper by Cardinal Spellman, read by the Rev. Miles Bourke of New York, heard papers written by the Rev. Kenneth Moore of the Carmelite Fathers, Washington; Father Fenton and the Rev. Thomas B. Falls of St. Charles Seminary of Overbrook, Pa. Father Moore's paper was read by the Rev. Joachim Smet, O.Carm., and Father Falls' by the Rev. Jasper J. Chiodini of St. German Hierarchical at Fulda.

## Korean Bishop Says Thanksgiving Mass

Seoul, Korea — (NC) — Bishop John Choe, Vicar Apostolic of Taegu, celebrated a Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving in the cathedral here for the re-establishment of the South Korean government in Seoul.

The Taegu faithful, who jammed the cathedral, at the same time commemorated the feast of the Korean martyrs. The feast is traditionally celebrated on September 26, but was postponed this year because of the Red military threat facing the city at that time.

## Munich Cardinal Fully Recovered

Munich — (NC) — His Eminence Michael Cardinal von Faulhaber, Archbishop of Munich and Freising, has fully recovered from a long illness, which caused him to cancel many engagements and forsake participation in this year's general meeting of the German Hierarchy at Fulda.
