### Father Davis Named Head Of Sacred Hearts Seminary

The Rev. Vincent W. Davis, S.S. CC., son of Mr. and Mrs. William B. Davis, 55 Winans St., Rochester is the new Superior and Rector of Sacred Hearts Seminary, Washington, D.C. His parents have been informed this week. This is the major seminary of the Congregation of the Fathers of the Sacred Hearts in the United States.

Appointment of Father Davis was announced from the Motherhouse of the Congregation in Braine-le-Comte, Belgium.

GRADUATED FROM St. Salome's School, Point Pleasant in 1933, Father Davis studied 5 years in St. Andrew's Seminary and in 1938 entered the Novitiate of the Fathers of the Sacred Hearts in Fairhaven, Mass.

Professed the following year, he continued his studies for the priesthood at the Major Seminary in Washington. He was ordained on May 18, 1944 at the end of the third year of theology.

The following year after completing his seminary studies, he entered the Catholic University of America for graduate studies. He received the Baccalaureate of Canon Law in June 1947, and the Licentiate in Canon Law in June 1947. Since then Father Davis has been a professor at the Seminary teaching in the departments of Canon Law and Moral Theology.

Since his ordination, Father Davis has also worked extensively in giving retreats to religious communities and in practical work. He spent six months in 1947 in Hawaii preaching retreats and aiding in parochial work.

He is the nephew of the Rev. L. Ernest Davis of Our Lady of Lourdes parish, Elmira, of Sister Rose Xavier, principal, St. Augustine's School and Sister Mary Leone, Holy Rosary School.
