Easy victors over four teams which had fine '49 records, but nothing this year to rate them as worthy competitors, the heavy, fast and versatile Aquinas squad expects a baptism of fire in Memorial Stadium this week.

IN ITS opener the Marylanders smothered Green Bay Military Academy in a 45-12. Then they jumped on George Washington University Fresh 27-6, swamped Staunton Military Academy 32-0 and coasted easily over Georgetown University Freshmen 29-10.

Rochesterians have scored 164 to their opponents' 59.

The future admits use a split T formation which may cause Aquinas defenses much trouble. Their line and backfield will weigh more than any visitors who have appeared here this season and their versatility of attack with fine passers and a half dozen fast backs promises a full day of work for the Connolly men.

WEIGHING MORE than 190 pounds average on the line and 175 pounds in the backfield, the Bulls gridders are said to have unusual depth with capable substitutes that may tire Aquinas early in the game. Shortage of relief players who can match a quality opponent all afternoon has been a problem of Coach Mickey Connolly which may lead to defeat this weekend.

Attendance has tapered off alarmingly in past Sundays as the visiting clubs failed to provide the contest expected. But ticket demand for the Bulls game indicates a crowd of more than 20,000 will be on hand for the 2 o'clock kickoff.

Niagara University — A total of 1631 students are in attendance at Niagara University, according to registration figures released by the Rev. Edward J. Kiernan, C.M., Ph.D., dean of the college of arts and sciences.

Community, Catholic Group, Individuals To Benefit From Will of John F. Wegman

Establishment of a perpetual foundation "for the welfare of the Rochester and Monroe County community," and specific bequests to Columbus Civic Centre, two prelates and a nun, are provided in the will of the late John F. Wegman, president of Wegman's Food Markets Inc.

Churches of Rochester; one of the United Jewish Welfare Fund of Rochester; the fourth representative of labor, to be chosen by local AFL and CIO groups, and the fifth to be selected by the Rochester Community Chest.

Mr. Wegman died at the age of 57 on Sept. 28. Requiem rites were held at St. Louis Church, Pittsford. He and an older brother, Walter, who died in 1936, founded the food concern.

THE WILL STIPULATES that the foundation shall have objects "which will make for the welfare of the Rochester and Monroe County community, and particularly giving assistance in the care of the aged, whether institutionalized or not, and to character-building agencies, such as the Columbus Civic Centre, YMCA, YWCA, JYM&WA, and in developing through educational work and otherwise, better relationships between capital and labor."

AMONG NUMEROUS specific bequests, including sums to three brothers and other relatives, Mr. Wegman bequeathed \$3,000 to Columbus Civic Centre to provide athletic memberships for boys between the ages of 14 and 18; \$3,000 to the Rt. Rev. Magr Joseph E. Grady, vice rector of St. Bernard's Seminary, and \$500 to the Rev. Louis Edelman of St. Louis Church, Pittsford.

The foundation will have as its objects, it is believed, of more than a half million dollars. It is to receive from the estate 50 per cent of the total issued and outstanding common stock of the Wegman food firm, plus 50 per cent of Mr. Wegman's net assets other than his food firm holdings.

Mr. Wegman left \$10,000 in trust for the benefit of his sister, Cecelia, known in religion as Sister Johanna Marie of the Sisters of St. Joseph, who is stationed at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Convent. In addition he directed the executors to purchase a station wagon to be given to the convent for her use.

Also provided is \$37,500 in legacies to 27 employees of the food firm, and \$10,000 to be divided among 76 employees with more than five years continuous service. Bequests of \$2,000 each were made to the Rochester Council of Boy Scouts, the After-School Social Hygiene Association of New York City, and the New
