

St. Patrick's, Dansville Marks 100th Anniversary

Dansville — The centennial celebration of St. Patrick's parish in Dansville was marked by a Solemn High Mass with His Excellency Bishop Kearney presiding on Oct. 22. The Rev. John C. O'Donnell pastor of St. Patrick's celebrated the Mass.

A Mass of Thanksgiving on Oct. 23 and a Memorial Mass for deceased members on Oct. 24 completed the celebration. A parish reception was held from 3 to 6 p. m. on Oct. 22.

ST. PATRICK'S parish was founded early in 1850 as the second Catholic parish in Dansville. St. Mary's was founded in 1845 to serve both German and Irish Catholics. Because of language difficulties, Bishop Timon of Buffalo sent Father O'Flaherty to Dansville to administer to the Irish Catholics, and from that group came the parish of St. Patrick's.

Parts of the present church of Spanish architecture date back to the beginning of the parish. The original church was of brick construction, and the brick interior was continued until stucco was added and entrances were changed 25 years ago under the direction of the Rev. John E. Massett. The Rev. James H. Day and the Rev. Michael C. J. Wall were responsible for earlier alterations.

Assisting Father O'Donnell in the Solemn High Mass were the Rev. Dennis W. Hickey, as deacon, and the Very Rev. John L. Rowan, O.F.M., rector of Christ the King Seminary at St. Bonaventure University was sub-deacon. The Rev. John Lyons of Louisville, Ky., was master of ceremonies. Father Hickey and Father Lyons are Dansville natives.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. John B. Sullivan and the Rev. Leo V. Smith of Rochester were chaplains to the Bishop. The Rev. Dr. John E. Maney, the Bishop's secretary was master of ceremonies for the Ordinary. Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus in full regalia served as escort to the Bishop.

Minor officers of the Mass were filled by students from St. Michael's Mission House at Hemlock Lake. A choir of students from there sang the Mass directed by the Very Rev. Raymond Weisenberger, S.V.D.

ABOUT 60 MEMBERS of the visiting clergy, students of St. Michael's Mission House and the Fourth Degree knights were guests at a dinner in Hotel Dansville ballroom. A dinner for about 35 visiting nuns was held in St. Patrick's school hall.

Confirmation was administered by Bishop Kearney at 2 p. m. Father O'Donnell, former pastor and priests and nuns of the parish held a reception in St. Patrick's School Hall.
