Sr. Alexandrine's Auburn Educator Describes Final Rites Held European Tour For Nurses At Motherhouse

Funeral services for Sister M. Alexandrine McCabe of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph were held at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, Monday, Oct. 30.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rev. W. O. Regan, C.S.B., assisted by the Rev. John A. Morgan, pastor of St. Francis church, Rochester, formerly of St. Francis de Sales parish; and Rev. Donald E. Lux, assistant pastor of St. Stephen's church.

Also in the sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Lawrence B. Casey, the Rev. Louis Edelman, the Rev. William J. Naughton, the Rev. James L. Callan, and the Rev. Michael Tydings.

Sister Alexandrine died Oct. 27, 1950 in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, after a long illness.

She entered the Sisters of St. Joseph from Auburn in 1899 and taught in St. Francis de Sales School, Agnes School, Avon, and in Immaculate Conception, Sacred Heart, St. Anthony, Blessed Sacrament and Corpus Christi schools in Rochester.

Surviving are a brother, Frederick McCabe of Syracuse, and a sister, Miss Margaret McCabe of Auburn.

Geneva — Over forty members of the Geneva unit of Catholic Nurses attended the annual banquet, Wednesday, Oct. 24, in Hotel Seneca. Guest speaker was Edwina M. Nolan, professor of English at Auburn High school. He talked on "A Pilgrimage To Rome."

Invocation was given by Rev. Robert H. Pennessy, chaplain of Geneva unit.

Guests of honor were Rev. John A. Reddington, assistant pastor of St. Ambrose church, Rochester, formerly of St. Francis de Sales parish; and Rev. Donald E. Lux, assistant pastor of St. Stephen's church.

MR. NOLAN described his visit to Fatima, Portugal, where he was "impressed by the spirit of prayer and penance that dominated the pilgrims," he said.

In Lourdes, France, the very air "seemed charged with faith, hope and charity," a faith "that was increased in all present, an undying hope, that surged up in those who were ill; and a charity manifested by all the nurses and attendants at the shrine of Our Lady," he continued.

Mr. Nolan told also of his experiences in Rome, Italy, and of 84,000 people gathered for an audience with His Holiness Pope Pius XII, and of mass offered in the catacombs at the tomb of St. Agnes.

IN PARIS, he visited the Chapel of the Miraculous Medal, where the body of St. Catherine Labourer, still remains intact in Lisleux he went to the home of St. Therese "the Little Flower" patroness for the conversion of Russia.
