Catholics Urged To Guide Radio Policy

London (NC)—An 11 nation conference on religious broadcasting being held this week at Chichester, Sussex, heard the Rev. Agnellus Andrew, O.F.M., Catholic adviser to the British Broadcasting Corporation complain that Catholics are not getting their weight in helping to formulate religious radio policy.

"How many Catholics, when they either like or dislike a religious program, take the trouble to tell the British Broadcasting Corporation direct?" he asked.

"How many bother about informing the corporation of an event of regional or national interest which otherwise might be overlooked?"

Father Agnellus described as "completely inaccurate and unfounded" a British national newspaper report that only one per cent of the public tunes in to religious broadcasts. The impact of television has somewhat upset programs, he said, but the high percentage of listeners to the regular BBC weekend religious broadcasts is being maintained.
