Rites Conducted For Fr. McArdle At Cemetery Here

Burial of the Rev. Edward McArdle in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Rochester took place Wednesday at 9 a. m. with the Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Hart, P.A., V.G. officiating, assisted by other priests of the Rochester diocese.

Father McArdle of Fargo, N. D., died Saturday, Nov. 11, 1950 in the Alexian Brothers Hospital, Oakbrook, Wis. He had been a patient at the hospital since he retired from parish work four years ago.

The body was accompanied here by the Rev. James Durkin, of the Fargo Diocese representing the Most Rev. Aloisius J. Muench, Bishop of Fargo.

Born in Rochester in 1875, Father McArdle attended old St. Patrick's Cathedral Grammar School and St. Andrew's Seminary. He was ordained for the Fargo Diocese and served there for nearly 50 years.

He was a brother of the late Sister M. Sidonia of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph and of the late Rev. Patrick McArdle of Scottsville for whose funeral he last came to Rochester in 1943.

He is survived by a sister, Rose, of Rochester.

Immaculate Parishioners Set 3 Father Lord Talks

The Rev. Daniel A. Lord, S.J., noted orator, pamphleteer and playwright will be heard in three addresses in Immaculate Conception school auditorium on Monday, Nov. 29 under the sponsorship of the Family Guidance Group.

EDITOR OF "The Queen's Work" and national director of the Sodality of Our Lady with headquarters in St. Louis, Mo., Father Lord will speak to the school children at 3 p.m.

AT 5:30 P.M., he will address children of the parish attending public and parochial high schools and those working who are of high school age. All adults of the parish are invited to his address at 8 p.m., the committee in charge stated.

Father Lord who was honored in 1940 by being elected to membership in the Academy of the Gallery of Living Catholic Authors, by the Board of Governors, entered the Society of Jesus in 1909 and was ordained in 1923.

He has been in Sodality work since 1926 and in addition to his prolific writing of books, pamphlets and plays has turned out widely accepted music compositions and has directed Summer Schools of Catholic Action in large cities.

The Family Guidance Group was organized in Immaculate Conception parish about two years ago with the approval of the Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph S. Cameron, pastor and is under the spiritual guidance of the Rev. George S. Wood, assistant pastor. Leo T. Minton attorney will preside at the Father Lord talks.

Final Tribute Paid M. H. Shea, Church Trustee

Funeral services for Michael H. Shea, outstanding Catholic layman and life-long member and trustee of Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester were held at the Ryan and McIntire, Inc. funeral chapel, 207 Chestnut St. and at the Plymouth Ave. church on Monday.

Mr. Shea, 86, of 37 Glasgow St. who was one of Rochester's first gasoline and oil distributors died Nov. 10, 1950 in St. Mary's Hospital after an illness of two weeks.

High Mass of requiem was offered by the Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph S. Cameron, pastor of the Immaculate Conception Church of which Mr. Shea had been a trustee.

Mr. Shea despite advancing years had been active in Catholic and civic circles. He was a board member and former treasurer of Aquinas Institute, a former board member of St. Mary's Hospital and former member of the Council of Rochester Regional Hospitals.

At the time of his death he was treasurer of St. Elizabeth Guild House. He was a member of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus and a former member of the Rochester Club.

From the time he was a member of the first graduating class of Immaculate Conception School, Mr. Shea had been active in the affairs of that parish and was frequently consulted by priests and parishioners on parish affairs.

He founded the Union Oil Works here in 1899. He retired in 1934 when he sold out to Colonial Beacon Oil Company, now Esso Standard Oil Company.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Richard D. Murphy, a son William J. Shea, seven grandchildren and two nephews.

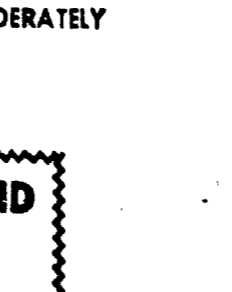
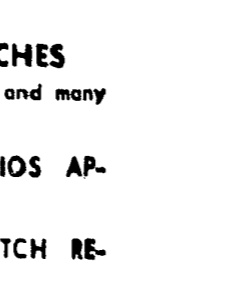
