

### Kerby Foundation Aims Told At Nazareth

Nazareth College Student Lecture series was opened Monday, Nov. 13, when Fenton Moran, executive secretary of the William J. Kerby Foundation, Washington, D.C., addressed the student body and faculty. Mr. Moran's topic was "Democracy and Responsibility."

He outlined the aims of the Kerby foundation stressing the importance of spiritual values in a working democracy and the necessity for social responsibility.

"The premises of the Declaration of Independence are essentially spiritual," Mr. Moran asserted, and the structure of our democracy built on these premises can withstand the onslaught of totalitarian ideologies only so long as we remain firm in the spiritual beliefs which created our way of life."

HE CHALLENGED the stu-

dents to keep in mind that the American way of life is in reality the way of Christian truth and urged them to pray that divine light may be given to our fellow Americans to see the spiritual truths necessary in a democratic society.

The Kerby Foundation was organized in 1941 as a memorial to the late Rev. Dr. William J. Kerby, professor of Sociology at the Catholic University of America to promote the principle of the dignity of man to make workable the principle which Dr. Kerby expressed. "Every man is a thought of God."

Mr. Moran was born in Hartford, Conn. and is a graduate of Georgetown University, College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Foreign Service, he also took several courses at the University of Grenoble in preparation for his work in the dip-

omatic service. He brings to the lecture platform a wide experience of living in many countries.

After a year of newspaper work in Albany, he served in Paris as an attaché of the Legation of the Republic of Liberia and as the delegate for Liberia at the Assembly of the League of Nations during the critical 30th.

IN CONNECTION with his diplomatic duties he traveled extensively in France, Switzerland, Belgium, Holland, England and other countries. After the German invasion in the spring of 1940 he remained in France until the German occupation; then in 1941.

From 1942 to 1943 he was attached to the Counter-Intelligence Corps of the American Army, spending most of that time in the Middle East — Palestine, Egypt and North Africa — and Europe. He was commissioned as a Counter-Intelligence officer in October 1944 and remained in the occupation forces in Germany until October 1945.

Since his discharge from the Army he has been the Executive Secretary of the Kerby Foundation. In 1946 he revisited Europe for several months. He is a contributor to The Sign, Columbia and The Catholic Digest.
