 Solemn funeral services for Sister Mary de Lourdes Kennedy, of the Order of Mercy, were conducted Saturday, Nov. 18 in the Motherhouse Chapel on Blossom Road.
 Sister Mary de Lourdes died Thursday, (Nov. 16, 1950) at the Motherhouse.
 The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas F. Connors was celebrant of the solemn High Mass; the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Duffy was deacon and the Rev. Dr. Charles J. Mahoney was sub-deacon. Rev. John T. Callahan, Chaplain at the Motherhouse, was Master of Ceremonies.
