**Dr. Nyaradi Says Tito Holds Fate Of World**

Whether United States accepts or rejects Tito and his regime will decide the fate of the world, Dr. Nicholas Nyaradi, ex-minister of finance of Hungary, told patrons of the Thomas More Lectures Forum, in an address Thursday evening in the Sheraton Hotel Ballroom.

Dr. Nyaradi spoke on "The Intimate Story of the Tito Rebellion" in his lecture sponsored by the Catholic Courier Journal.

He has been a voluntary exile from Russian dominated Hungary, since December, 1948.

"America is the last hope of democracy and freedom on earth," Dr. Nyaradi said, "and the funeral dirge will sound for communism or for democracy, the choice is the United States."

Dr. Nyaradi, who spent several months in Moscow in 1946 discussing Hungarian reparations due Russia as result of World War II, charged that the present Tito who speaks several languages replaced the illiterate Joseph Broz who led the Communist movement in Yugoslavia during World War II. Broz was recalled to Moscow after the Nazi surrender in 1945.

RELATING THE treachery and under-handed dealings of the Yugoslavian dictator, the former Hungarian official charged that Tito is the favorite son of the Soviet. Although he has the support of only 10% of the Yugoslavian people, Tito claims the support of a strong army, which is well-fed and well-clothed.

"There is and was a great, true, and real play to make Americans believe that Yugoslavia has severed relations with the Russians," Dr. Nyaradi said, "but this is difficult to believe because Tito has proved in at least two instances that he trusts Russians and only Russians after his own army." Tito's army is composed of mountain peasants, thieves and killers, according to the ex-minister of finance.

In comparing Yugoslav generals and Soviet generals, Dr. Nyaradi pointed out that they are identical down to the medals.
